## Schools study handwriting to understand students better

KOLKATA: City schools are increasingly turning to graphology — the science of analysing handwriting — in order to understand the special needs of students instead of resorting to corporal punishment to discipline them. "Through graphology, you can't only identify nearly 180 character traits of an individual, but even change them to some extent by changing the handwriting in a scientific manner. And this is what some top-

ranking city schools, and even some teachers on their own, are attempting," director of the Kolkata Institute of Graphology Mohan Bose told HT.

Bose said the institute had already trained teachers of such schools as MC Kejrival Vidya-peeth and Laxmipti Singhania Academy. More than 30 teachers of several other top schools, including La Martiniere, Future Foundation, Assembly of God Church and DPS have undergone courses in graphology.

"We'd sent about 25 teachers from various departments and classes of our school to get them trained in graphology. They were taught how to iden-

tify certain character traits by analysing handwriting. The results have, indeed, surprised all of us," said KK Kejrival,

managing trustee of M C Kejrival Vidya-peeth, which has about 3,000 students. Bose said his institute had

come up with a specially tailored course spanning two and a half months to train school teachers. The course, which

costs ₹7,000, also imparts knowledge in child psychology.

"The course covers more than 50 aspects of child psychology, including mood disorders, conflicts, social relationships, parent-child relationship, memory retention, suicidal tendencies and crime-prone behaviour, among others," Bose added.

Bose explained that the human brain was highly malleable and could be dramatically influenced by external factors. All aspects of an individual's experience can alter the brain circuit and induce changes in it. "When an individual changes his handwriting in a scientific manner, as prescribed by a graphologist, and

practises it regularly it reacts back to our thoughts via the same neuro-muscular path and influences the thought process. This is an age-old practice and is being exploited across the world," Bose added.

"The use of graphology to understand the psyche of students has become all the more important and useful at a time when society's changing very fast. There've been several incidents over the past few years where students have either committed suicide or have reacted violently against their teachers when the latter tried to mend their behaviour in a traditional manner," said a senior teacher.

## Anti-graft Act will cover bribe-givers

Singh hints at tough anti-corruption legislation

NEW DELHI: In a decision that could prove to be a game-changer in the fight against corruption, the government is planning to amend the anti-graft Act to cover bribe-givers, especially private companies, instead of only the bribe-taker.

Prime Minister Manmohan Singh announced this on Wednesday, saying "Experience has shown that in a vast majority of cases, it is difficult to tackle consensual bribery and the bribe-giver gets away by taking advantage of the Prevention of Corruption Act." He said big-ticket corruption was mostly related to operations by commercial entities. "It is, therefore, also proposed to include corporate failure to prevent bribery as a new offence."

Inaugurating a conference of the CBI and state anti-corruption bureaus in Delhi, the PM said his regime would provide a clear definition of "corruption", and also amend the Act to "protect honest public servants".

### 44 proposals okayed in just 3 meetings

New Delhi: Stung by the alleged policy paralysis, Prime Minister Manmohan Singh has got 44 proposals through in the last three meetings of his cabinet. Singh led the last cabinet meeting to take 18 decisions in just one-and-a-half hours. The cabinet committee on economic affairs approved five items in half-an-hour while the cabinet committee on infrastructure decided on three issues in 15 minutes flat. What's more, the cabinet committee on political affairs took barely 20 minutes to decide on reducing the subsidy on LPG and diesel. >>P9

## S&P MAY DOWNGRADE INDIA'S CREDIT RATING DESPITE THE REFORMS

NEW DELHI: US credit rating agency Standard and Poor's (S&P) warned on Monday that India still faced a "one in three" chance of a downgrade despite the recent spate of moves to open up the insurance, pension and multi-brand retail sectors to foreign investment — the boldest reforms initiated by the UPA since assuming power in 2004. "The negative outlook signals at least a one-in-three likelihood of a downgrade of the sovereign rating on India within the next 24 months," S&P analysts said in a note.

The effects of the announcement were immediately visible: the Sensex tumbled by 162 points to close at 18,631 and the rupee fell below the 53-rupee mark.

The agency also maintained India's rating at BBB-, which is only a notch above "junk". A downgrade would mean India would have to pay higher interest rates on its public borrowings.

## Animal welfare: Tigers get more money, rhinos drone protection

Nine-fold hike in government funds for the big cat as other endangered species like elephants get a raw deal

NEW DELHI: Tigers have taken the lion's share in wildlife funding for the next five years. The country's top advisory body, the Planning Commission, has allocated ₹5,889 crore for 1,706 tigers in the 12th Five-Year Plan (2012-17) compared with ₹615 crore in the 11th Five-Year Plan (2007-12) — a nine-fold increase in allocation.

For all other wildlife species, including about 26,000 elephants, 300 lions in Gujarat and about 16,000-20,000 leopards in India living in 600 other protected areas, the money provided is just ₹3,600 crore. In the 11th Five-Year Plan, Indian wildlife had got ₹800 crore, higher than the funds for tigers.

The argument being forwarded for making the allocation is that the tigers are the flagship species and money spent on their protection automatically benefits other wildlife species, such as deer or rhinos. The reality is that most of the money will be spent on relocation of around 10,000 families living inside 41 tiger habitats of the country, considered a threat to tigers and for filling forest guard vacancies in these reserves.

"Several new thrust areas have been identified for implementation. This includes strengthening protection and

ment on wildlife says.

What is skewed in the government's wildlife plan is that there is no focus on other species. In fact, separate funding for elephants under the 11th Plan has been merged with the existing scheme, the Integrated Development of Wildlife Habitats.

There is no mention of Asiatic lions, whose only home in the wild in Asia is the Gir National Park in Gujarat. The Centre has not been able to fulfill its commitment for better monitoring of lions because of a lack of funds.

The same is the story for snow leopards, whose number is now estimated to be less than 1,000 in the upper reaches of the Himalayas in Uttarakhand, Himachal Pradesh and Jammu and Kashmir.

Leopards, whose poaching has almost doubled in the past five years, are also missing from the Five-Year Plan document. Not a single endangered bird, such as the Great Indian Bustard, vultures and sparrows, finds a mention in the 1,600-page Five-Year Plan document.

Wildlife says the majority of endangered wildlife live outside the tiger reserves in 600 protected areas, which are in a shambles and under constant threat of degradation because of development and other biotic pressures.

## Unmanned planes will guard Kaziranga Park

GUWAHATI: Union minister for environment and forests Jayanthi Natarajan, who made a daylong visit to the famed one-horned rhino's home, Kaziranga National Park, in the state on Wednesday, said an unmanned aircraft would soon be introduced for surveillance in the park.

"For many years, Kaziranga has been the best-managed National Park in the country. We're concerned over the recent developments. For round-the-clock surveillance in the park, we'll add more trained frontline staff and nine speedboats. Battery-operated unmanned aircraft will also be introduced for surveillance soon", Natarajan said.

Natarajan's visit to the park was significant, since Kaziranga was devastated in the recent floods and there was spurt in rhino poaching over the past month.



which is a UNESCO heritage site lost 39 rhinos from January 1 this year. Poachers killed 11 rhinos, while 28 others drowned in the floods.

She, chief minister Tarun Gogoi and state forest minister Rockybul Hussain met the Park authorities and reviewed the situation. Natarajan said her ministry was extremely concerned over the recent loss of animal lives. She announced a ₹1-crore grant from the National Tiger Conservation Fund for Kaziranga's tiger reserve, declared in 2006 to increase the tiger population in the Park. The Park has the distinction of having highest density of tigers in a protected area in the country.

Expressing satisfaction over the Kaziranga authorities' steps for developing 152 forest camps, Natarajan stressed the need for creation of a buffer zone, which, according to her, would reduce man-animal conflict in the Park's surrounding areas.

The Park authorities demanded that more anti-poaching forest camps in the Kaziranga tiger reserve's adjoining areas.

## Molestation charge against senior CPM leader's son

KOLKATA: In this season of crime against women and chaos on the campus, here's another shocker. A third year Botany student of Bidhannagar Government College has filed a police complaint alleging that Shaptarshi Deb, son of former housing minister Goutam Deb, molested her near the college on Wednesday afternoon.

The incident immediately took a political colour since Shaptarshi, besides being the son of a senior CPI(M) leader, is also an important functionary of the SFI, the student's wing of the CPI(M). And the girl is the unit head of rival Trinamool Chhatra Parishad.

Ever since the change of government in the state, colleges and universities have become a battleground, with both the Trinamool and Left unions competing for supremacy. There have been several instances of not only student clashes, but teachers too have borne the brunt of the campus chaos.

According to the victim's version, Shaptarshi Deb, along with other SFI activists, pulled at her dupatta from inside a speeding car while she was returning to college after some personal work near Labony Estate in Salt Lake. The girl

also alleged that the speeding car tried to run over her.

Supantha Roy, general-secretary of the Bidhannagar College union controlled by the Trinamool Congress — elections to the union are to be held soon — the girl was first abused and when she did not pay heed to it, the occupants of the car pulled at her dupatta.

Shaptarshi Deb later said that the allegations against him were false and intended to malign him and the SFI, which promptly came to his defence. State SFI boss Debojyoti Das claimed that there were inconsistencies in the allegations of the woman. "Her allegations were based on the assumption that she could have been harmed," Das said, adding that the incident was pre-planned by the Trinamool. "How come the local Trinamool MLA rushed to the police station where the complaint was filed," he asked.

The cops have started a case based on the girl's complaint, said additional deputy commissioner of Bidhannagar Ranen Bandopadhyay.

## Escalator of Gariahat overbridge does not work

Constructed in December 2004 this is the country's first footbridge with an escalator and an elevator. Scared by a spate of fatal accidents near Bijon Setu, the guardians of students of several schools in the area (including South Point and Patha Bhavan) approached the civic authorities for a footbridge. The construction of the footbridge started following a build-own-operate agreement between the KMC and Selvel in December 2003.

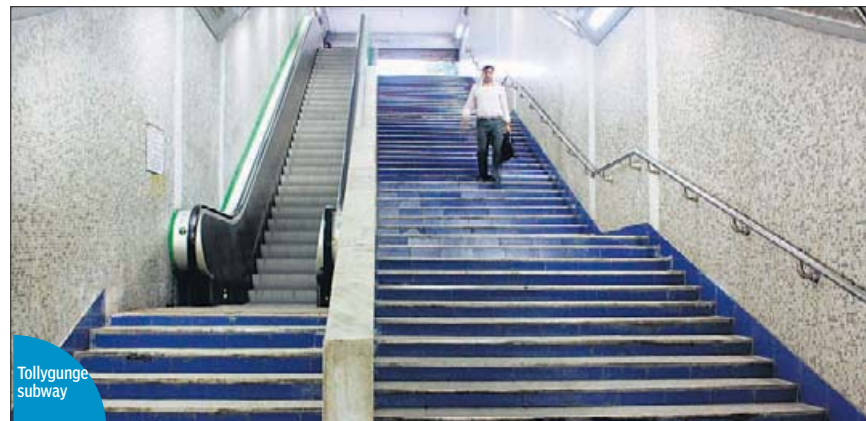
**Location:** The footbridge is located right at the Rashbehari Avenue-Cornfield

Road-Ekdalia Road crossing.

**What HT noticed:** Around 5 pm on Monday when HT visited the footbridge there were hardly any pedestrians using it. Jaywalkers, those include school students and guardians, still prefer to take risks and cross the busy Rashbehari Road right below the footbridge. Both the escalator and the elevator were shut down leaving the users with the only option of using the staircase. Security officials of Selvel — the advertising company who would look after the flyover till 2033 — said they did not face any problems to count the number of users per day. "Today

between 2 pm and 5 pm only three people used the footbridge," said one of the security official.

**Problems:** An engineer of the Kolkata Municipal Corporation said, one of the basic reasons behind such a low footfall on the footbridge was that people did not want to take the pain to walk up the 25 stairs and again walk down another 25 stairs. "Technically the construction of the foot bridge is not full proof. There are lots of openings for pedestrians to hit the road from pavements on both sides of the footbridge. These help the pedestrians cross the road avoiding the footbridge," he said.

## New metro route has made this one useless

A pilot project initiated by Mamata Banerjee in 1999 when she became the first woman railway minister of the country, the subway was completed and commissioned by the Kolkata Metro in 2001 when Nitish Kumar was the railway minister. **Location:** Located right inside the compound of the Tollygunge metro stations it helps the pedestrians reach the Tollygunge tram depot from the Tollygunge Metro station and vice versa. **What HT noticed:** Absolutely neat and clean, it seemed that there hardly had been any footfalls in the sub-

way for the last 11 years. Around 3 pm when HT reached the subway there were few people standing at the entry gate at the station-side. Apparently they were the customers of the food and soft drinks stalls inside the metro compound. In the next 20 minutes two metros arrived and hundreds of commuters got down. But no one took the subway to cross the road.

"Around 32,000 passengers exit from this station on weekdays. However, hardly a dozen of them take the subway," said a senior metro railway official.

**Problems:** When the subway was

constructed there were no Metro services beyond Tollygaunj. Garia bound metro commuters had to get down at Tollygunge and cross the road to take an auto or bus. Since Metro got extended till Garia station only the Haridevpur, Kabardanga, Thakurpukur and Behala-bound commuters get down at Tollygaunj. "Unfortunately, these commuters catch buses or autos from the spot right opposite to the old metro rail shed. However, we do not have any entry or exist points there. So it remains useless for better part of the day," said a metro railway official.

## No one to miss Park Circus footbridge

Following a series of accidents right in front of the bridge number 4, KMC and advertising agency Selvel had installed the Park Circus footbridge in 2007.

**Location:** The footbridge is located right at the crossing of the Park Circus - Bypass Connector and Darga Road in front of the Bridge number 4.

**What HT noticed:** Around 6 pm on Monday when HT visited the spot there was total traffic chaos near the bridge number 4 crossing. Thousands of jaywalkers were crossing the road ignoring traffic signals. Drivers had to apply brakes every second and it was taking more than a minute for a car to cross the signal. Right above, the footbridge meant for the pedestrians was lying unused. In about 15 minutes HT noticed that only a single woman, in her 30s, took the footbridge.

**Problems:** KMC engineers said that when the flyover was constructed they tried to erect railings on the pavements leading to the two staircases on both sides of the road. The local shopkeepers resisted. "Without the railings, pedestrians find it easy to get down on the road and cross the connector. The net result has been that the crossing still remains an accident prone zone," said a KMC engineer.

Officials of Selvel said they had lost interest in the footbridge following a directive from the state government. "Recently we have received a directive from the state government asking us to dismantle the footbridge to make way for the construction of the flyover connecting Park Circus Maidan and Parama Island," said Subash Niyogi, MD Selvel.

## Hardly any takers for the Jadavpur subway

PWD constructed the subway in 2005 just before the 2006 assembly polls.

**Location:** Located right on the 8B bus stand in Jadavpur, the subway connects the 8B flank of the Raja SC Mullick Road with the Jadavpur Station Road - Raja SC Mullick Road crossing.

**What HT noticed:** Around 4 pm on Monday, groups of university students were sitting and standing at the main entrance of the 8B bus stand-side of the subway. Pedestrians from the 8B bus stands were simply

the fact that there was a drizzle outside. The main subway was extremely dirty. HT also spotted a few vagabonds, who had made this subway their home.

**Problems:** Thanks to the auto raj and continuous entry and exit of big states buses from the 8B bus stand, the stretch between the 8B crossing and Sukanta Setu on Raja SC Mullick road always stay congested. As vehicles move at a very low speed through this stretch, pedestrians find it easy to cross the road without feeling the need to use the subway.

ignoring the subway while crossing the road. At the entrance of the subway at the other side of the road, a few fruit sellers were sitting on the pavement partially blocking the entrance. Inside the subway there

were a few couples occupying the staircase, while some PWD employees were sitting in a room right below the staircase. For 15 minutes this correspondent waited at the spot but no one took the subway despite

## For a change, this one is used by people

The Kolkata Municipal Corporation constructed the footbridge in 1992. The Peerless group is maintaining it.

**Location:** Located right at the Ultadanga crossing it helps pedestrians to go to the VIP Road connector, to the HIDCO crossing and from the EM Bypass crossing to the Ultadanga station bound road and vice versa.

**What HT noticed:** This is perhaps the only footbridge in the city which is regularly used by the pedestrians. On it you could even see scuffles as the one shown in the picture on your left.

**Problems:** Although it's a three mouth crossing, apparently there are six lanes meeting at the crossing: one from the Khanna side, second from the EM Bypass side, third from the Salt Lake side and the fourth from the VIP Road. Then there are the two lanes on both sides of the VIP Road-bound flyover. "The roads connect in a very scattered way. Owing to a heavy density of traffic and such geographical condition the flyover was constructed in '92. It turned out to be one of the very few successful footbridge projects because people still fear to cross the roads at this crossing. Secondly, the traffic is so heavy that it takes longer time to cross if one wants to avoid the footbridge," said a KMC engineer.

Police, however, tries to keep a strict vigil on the footbridge to curb incidents like the one shown in the photograph. But owing to shortage of police personnel it becomes difficult to keep a round-the-clock vigil. "We have dedicated teams that conduct rounds throughout the area under our jurisdiction," contradicted a senior police officer.

# Ministers yet to get Sept pay

**PUJA DAMPENER** 37 ministers have not been paid their salaries due to a bureaucratic glitch

**KOLKATA:** Red tape is as old as the institution of government itself, but this one beats many previous low watermarks. As many as 37 ministers of Mamata Banerjee's government have become victims of red tape as they are yet to get the salary for September; thanks to lack of instructions from the chief minister's office (CMO) to the constitution branch of the home department, which prepares the salary.

Old timers in Writers' Buildings have told HT that there is no precedence of ministers' salary being held up in recent memory.

The constitution branch is

yet to receive the instruction from the CMO about the resignation of the six Congress

ministers who resigned on September 22.

The constitution branch had no orders to prepare the salary without the six former Congress ministers, and so it has held up the entire process.

"The official order for preparing the salary without the six former Congress ministers has

to reach the constitution branch, which would start preparing the October salary of the ministers before Puja," said an officer of the constitution branch.

Ironically, the constitution branch and CMO are located in adjacent rooms and are only a few yards apart. The pay and accounts office is in Phears Lane, which is less than a km from Writers' Buildings. Ministers get a salary of ₹8,000 only. The cheque meant for the chief minister is held up too, though she has not drawn any salary since the first month.

Despite great financial crisis, the state government has managed to pay its employees in time so far. On Wednesday, law minister

Malay Ghatak and tourism minister Rachpal Singh confirmed to HT that they are yet to paid their September salary. West Bengal government's employees get their salary on the last day of the month.

Sources in the home department said October salary too could also be delayed as the file related to the resignation of the six Congress ministers is lying with the chief secretary.

The constitution branch waited for more than a week and then processed the salary of all the ministers including those who have resigned as they worked for 21 days of September.

The branch sent the file of the 43 ministers to the drawing and disbursement officer (DDO) of the home department.

The DDO raised the bills for the salary in two parts and then sent the bills to the pay and accounts department for preparing the salary cheques.

"I have sent the bills for the salary to the pay and accounts department. But have not yet issued the cheques as the person who deals with the salary cheques of the ministers is on leave," said DDO of the home department, Shyamal Chakraborty. Sources in the home department told Hindustan Times the pay and accounts department, which issues cheques, is facing shortage of staff, though that was not the official reason for holding back the salary of the ministers.

**METRO BREAKS ITS OWN RECORD OF MOST PASSENGERS CARRIED**

**KOLKATA:** On Saturday, October 6, Kolkata Metro Railway broke its own record of the largest number of passenger it transported in a day. ## MAMATA GIVES TAXI LOAN TO MINORITIES

**KOLKATA:** Chief minister Mamata Banerjee's new trump card to woo the minorities is to give them a 'taxi loan' at a time when fuel price has skyrocketed.

At a function organised by the Minority Affairs & Madrasah Education Department and West Bengal Minority Development & Finance Corporation (WBMDFC), Banerjee handed over the key to one person and offer letters to nine other beneficiaries of the new scheme started by the WBMDFC - taxi loan.

"Beneficiaries would get a loan of ₹4,52,000 each. The nine who had been given offer letters will be given a key to their vehicles on completing all the paper work. There would have been more beneficiaries, had the high court order against BSIII vehicles not been there. Since there is no pressure for the next six months we intend to give 100 more taxis to applicants by March 31 2013," Abu Ayesha Mondal, chairman, WBMDFC said.

Members of other minority groups — Sikhs, Christians and Buddhists — along with their religious leaders were also present at the gathering. Banerjee also gave out education loans to students and highlighted her government's work in respect to the minorities of the state.

"Whatever we had promised to do in five years, we have done in one year. The next four years we will plan and do newer things," Mamata Banerjee said, flanked by her usual aides and cabinet ministers such as Firhad Hakim, Sultan Ahmed, Rachpal Singh, Mukul Roy, Malay Ghatak and Madan Mitra.

She said that the proposed Aliya University, spread over 20 acres of land, had been planned in such a fashion that it would be the number one university in the world.

## Cash-strapped govt spent ₹2.7 cr on investigations

**KOLKATA:** The cash-strapped state government has already spent ₹2.07 crore behind the commissions of inquiry which were set up to probe incidents that rocked Bengal during Left and Trinamool rule.

Mamata Banerjee after taking charge as the chief minister announced 10 commissions of inquiry into the incidents like Sainbari massacre in 1970, mysterious death of BDO Kallol Sur in April 2010, police firing on Youth Congress supporters during a rally to Writers' Buildings in July 1993, Magrahat firing in December 2011, AMRI fire in December 2011, irregularities in distribu-

tion of plots of land at Rajarhat, mass killings at Cossipore-Baranagar in 1971, police firing on Santhal rally in West Midnapore in 1999 killings of Ananda Margis on Bijan Setu in 1982 and death of CPI(M) MLA Mostafa Bin Kasem in May 2011.

The report of the commission to probe the mysterious death of Ananda Margis was submitted before the government. Five commissions have started functioning while four are yet to start their probes.

Sources in the home (political) department said, the state government has already spent ₹2.07 crore. "Most commissions are given extension as finding an office space for day to day functioning is time consuming. This doubles

the cost," said a senior official of the home (political) department.

The department is not sure about the starting of another four commissions of inquiry on Rajarhat land scam, mass killings at Cossipore-Baranagar, police firing on Santhals at West Midnapore and killings of Ananda Margis.

The state government has to bear the salary of the chairman of the commission, the secretary and other office bearers. The government has to pay the telephone bills of the commission, conveyance and other allowances of the officials of the commissions. The home (political) department estimated that another ₹10 Crore would be spent for these pending inquiries.

## State fails to renew contract of 200 docs at healthcare centres

**KOLKATA:** It has been found that nearly 200 doctors practicing at primary hospitals and health care centres across the state as medical officers (MO) have been attending to patients, including accident and rape victims, despite having no official appointment letter. This situation developed on September 30, when their contracts expired.

The state health department recruited these doctors on an ad hoc basis during August 2010. After assuming power, Mamata Banerjee met these Mos at Town Hall and promised to regularise their jobs in permanent posts.

"We have extended the ad hoc service of these doctors but we cannot recruit them in permanent service without the finance department's approval," said Dr BR Satpathi, director of health ser-

vices. Although Satpathi declined to admit it, it appears that the fates of the doctors are at the mercy of the finance department.

However, several doctors told HT that their services have not yet been extended by the government, and they are, therefore, attending duty illegally.

"We have met the director of health services and other senior officials at Swasthya Bhaban, requesting them to recruit us in permanent service. But, they have not extended our ad hoc service, let alone recruiting us to permanent posts. We do not have

any official recognition whatever. It's not fair or safe to attend to patients linked with criminal cases or accident victims at a time when we do not have any identity," said a MO associated with a block primary health centre in Sonarpur, South 24 Parganas.

"There is every possibility of getting involved in medico legal cases if any of us attend to patients injured in accidents or crimes, and fill forms in connection with alleged rape incidents or injury cases. Therefore, we must have official status when we work in emergency services," said another MO attached with a rural hospital in Tarakeswar in Hooghly district. In August 2011, the state government sanctioned their ad hoc services for a year, till September 30. However, the government has failed to provide them with permanent jobs or extend their ad hoc agreement till the period following September 30.

## Scotland destination for poor students

**KOLKATA:** Asif Ahmed and Cain Francis Gomes, both 21-year-old, have got full scholarship to complete their graduation at the Edinburgh Napier University (ENU) in Scotland. This is more than a dream come true for these two young men coming from the economically weaker section of the society. "Didn't even dream of it," said Ahmed after getting the scholarship, on Wednesday in a function held at the GD Birla Sabhaghar, from no other than the principal and vice-chancellor of the University, professor Dame Joan Stringer. "It's like going to the moon," seconded Gomes.

Ahmed joined St George's School, a sister school of St Mary's School and Orphanage when he was a student of class 8. He later shifted to St Mary's. His father sells toys. Ahmed has a brother and a sister. Gomes lost his parents in a car accident at Colaba, Mumbai when he was eight years old. It was 1999. His grand uncle brought him to Kolkata and put him in Class 1 of St George's in 2000.

"We take in students who are materially poor. They are rich in every other way. They are generally sharp and intelligent. We go to their homes to see how poor they are. And if we find that they are too poor to afford English medium education we take them," said James Joseph, who teaches these underprivileged students English and Home Science at St Mary's Orphanage. He is a senior secondary teacher. "Various Christian organizations send us students. But we do not keep religion in mind when we take them. They are given free education under National Open School," Joseph said.

Under the national open school section students are taught humanities and their English language skills are commendable. "Aim of our section of the school is to help the poor students realise that they too can achieve highest possible result and enter the competitive world as equals," said Joseph. Ahmed and Gomes are the products of the National Open School. After school, they went on to study Hospitality Management at the International Institute of Hotel Management (IIHM) and would be doing the last year of their graduate studies at Edinburgh. "Their first two years of study at IIHM was

sponsored by friends of St Mary's from Ireland," said Joseph. In fact it was the good impression left by Badar Azim, another underprivileged student of St Mary's, who completed his BA in Hospitality Management at ENU last year and is now working as a butler at the Buckingham Palace that paved the way for Ahmed and Gomes to study at ENU. "We didn't apply for the scholarship. ENU authorities saw Azim's qualities and his zeal to help other underprivileged students and decided to help such poor students from Kolkata. And Asif and Cain got the opportunity. Pauline Gordon, lecturer ENU was the driving force behind the scholarships," said Joseph. "Students of St Mary's had done well before. Their spirit of giving back had inspired other students. I believe Asif and Cain would consider the opportunity as life-changing and work towards enabling other students from a similar background," said professor Stringer. "Once they get jobs after completing studies, they will have to give society back what they have got," confirmed Joseph.

# Price hike hits Puja

**SCRIMP AND SAVE** By cutting down on non-essentials & doing some of the work themselves, Puja organisers have been able to make smaller budgets go a longer way

Every Durga Puja, people decked out in their best go pandal hopping, eat at the best restaurants and revel in the beauty and spirit of the festival, without sparing a thought for the blood, sweat and tears that go into making it all come together. Every intricate little detail needs to be taken care of so that there are no last minute glitches. A more mammoth task, however, lies in budgeting the whole affair, especially now, with rising prices and increased labour costs tightening people's belts.

While there can be no compromising with the idols, arrangements for the rituals or, indeed, the mandap, which is often the centre of attraction, Puja committees have devised other ways to balance out the price problem.

"We are very lucky to have got labour

cheaply. Last time, labour had cost us ₹1.4 lakh. This time no one was charging less than ₹1.6 lakh. After much research, we found a group of workers from Bongaon in North 24 Parganas, who agreed to work for just ₹75,000. This made a huge difference to our budget," said Saikat Roychoudhury, secretary of the Putiary Club Durgotsav committee.

The price of *kadam* tree wood, used to make the mandap, has risen from ₹180 to ₹260 per unit in the last year, gum is up from ₹700 to ₹750 for five kilos, while 4 mm ply registered a ₹10 increase. It's no wonder puja organisers are finding it increasingly difficult to manage costs! Prices of other materials used for making the mandap have similarly skyrocketed.

"We also procured all the raw materials from their sources of origin and not from retailers in the open market. For example, all glass-related items, like bangles for the deities and other decorative items, were brought from Kanpur, Agra and Lucknow in Uttar Pradesh. The travel expenses were borne by us. This, too, saved a large part of our Puja funds," added Roychoudhury.

The toll on lighting and decorations has been severe this year, due to the cost-cutting measures implemented by Puja committees. While Puja organisers are not keen on compromising on the idols themselves, the glitter and gleam of the pandals may

have gone down a notch in their need to economise.

"Last year, we spent ₹15 lakh on decorations and ₹2 lakh for lighting. This year, we've toned it down to ₹12 lakh and ₹1.75 lakh for decorations and lighting, respectively. The fact that advertisements are also harder to come by has only added to our woes," said Shyama Banerjee, assistant treasurer at Kalighat Sanghshree Durgotsav committee.

"This time we have also used cheaper materials for constructing the *mandap*. Last time, we had used iron materials including strong wires and huge picture collages all over the place that were quite expensive. Even the goddesses trishul was made of galvanised wire. This time we made the mandap entirely out of paper pulp and clay to cut down on costs," Banerjee added.

This cost crunch has affected even the themes this year, and the Kalighat Sanghshree Puja organisers are not the only one who are practicing thrift.

"This year we have allocated ₹1 lakh for lighting purposes as compared to the ₹1.2 lakhs we spent last year. Every year we procure special Chandannagar lights for decorations. This time, the idea has been shelved. Also, one of our club members, who is an electrician by profession, has taken up the responsibility of lighting. That too cut our costs by almost half," said Shibu Das, assis-

tant secretary of Ultadanga Bidhan Sangha.

Some organisers have decided to lend a hand themselves for constructing the mandap to save on labour costs. As some claim with a grin, it has come as a blessing in disguise for them. The pujas will provide them a perfect opportunity to practice their artistic skills and display their talents.

"This time we're doing *Tasher Desh*, based on *Jorasanko Thakurbari* as our theme. Nearly 50 of us came together to construct the mandap. This way, we save labour charges to a large extent," said Subrata Dey of Bhawanipore Swadhin Sangha.

Unfortunately, the quality of *maayer bhog*, something we all look forward to during *Dashami*, may also take a beating. With prices of rice, pulses and vegetables soaring to unfathomable heights, organisers are left with no alternative.

"Since food prices have increased, it is no longer possible for us to afford the same quality of bhog, especially as subscriptions have remained static. Instead of the ₹40 per kilo *gobindobhog* rice we provided last year, this time we will serve the ₹30 per kilo *gobindobhog* rice," said Banerjee.

However, these are mere details, and as long as the rains don't play spoilsport, the indomitable Bengali will take all the little nips and tucks in their stride and relish the biggest four days of the year, as they are generally wont to do.

In keeping with its tradition of coming up with unique artistic themes, the Vivekananda Park Athletic Club Puja plans to wow visitors with their theme, *aarati*, depicted through several layers of decoration portraying the form of offering prayers to the deity. On entering the pandal, expect to see scores of people looking up at the sky with devotion in their eyes, preparing to offer their *aarati* to the Gods.

"We are making hundreds of fibreglass models in human form, dressed in their Puja best, *saris*, *dhotis* and *namaboli*. At the entrance, these models will be looking upwards in anticipation of offering *aarati*. Then, there will be a water tank in the middle, reflecting the entire pandal," said club assistant secretary Subhankar Saha.

"In the second part of the pandal, these models will be show sitting for puja, offering their prayers to the goddess Durga, emerging from the Shivalinga. The light work around the pandal, including the idols, will be with LED lights. The concept was created by well-known Durga Puja artist Amar Sarkar," he added.

## Crisis deepens at Haldia

BIZARRE A day after Mamata described the situation as normal, losses mount for Kolkata Port Trust

**HALDIA:** A day after chief minister Mamata Banerjee described the situation at Haldia Dock Complex (HDC) as "normal", crisis deepened at HDC as its highest revenue earner said that no agreeable solution has been worked out so far for them to start operations at berths two and eight, being operated by the Mumbai-based firm.

On Wednesday, the two berths, which handle 40,000 tonnes of cargo every day, remained shut for 19 consecutive days, prompting Laxman Seth, former CPI(M) MP and Haldia CPI(M) strongman, to question the credibility of Mamata's statement. HDC sources claimed that the KoPT has lost about ₹11.55 crore due to suspension of work at berths two and eight.

"I saw the HDC was in full workflow. Everything is normal there. A section of the media is intentionally running a disinformation campaign to malign the government," Mamata said in Haldia on Tuesday.

"The chief minister must have been misinformed," Seth, who is on bail and restricted

from entering East Midnapore district except for court appearances, told HT over the phone. "How could the situation be described normal if the highest earning berths are not operating?" Seth asked, while accusing KoPT of letting HBT's rivals to make huge profits while HBT suffers losses.

On Wednesday, ABG Haldia Bulk Terminals (HBT) said that they are yet to accept the draft resolution discussed during the meeting of the nine-member committee on October 6 and 7.

HBT suspended operations on September 22, blaming labour unrest. They sacked the employees blaming 'under-utilisation' of their machineries 'resulting in huge losses'.

"We reiterate our stand that we shall consider reinstating them (the 275 sacked workers) if KoPT gives us as additional work backed by suitable guarantees, under the legal framework, which will allow us to meet the recurring expenditure of their salary and wages," Gurpreet Malhi, CEO of HBT,

said on Wednesday.

HBT alleged that their employees were threatened twice on Wednesday, once in front of their office at Haldia City Centre and then on the berth two of HDC. Expressing its "greatest concern to the continued state of lawlessness at Haldia Dock Complex", Malhi, said, "HBT is extremely worried and saddened by such continued violent turn of events continuing."

A couple of days ago, KoPT officials had claimed to have

## BIRDS ON RUNWAY DELAY OPERATIONS AT DUM DUM

Then the bird chasers were called. Meanwhile four flights, which were supposed to land were kept on hold. Sources said that two IndiGo, one Air India and one Jet Airways flight were told to hover.

## Peaceful polling in Jangipur bypoll

**JANGIPUR:** Jangipur voted peacefully and 67.8% of the electorate voted amid huge security arrangement.

Everyone was keeping a close eye on the election as the president's son, Avjit Mukherjee, was contesting as the Congress candidate. Just 4 days before the election, a murder of a CPI(M) leader at Mukundapur village caused tension.

In the last Lok Sabha election (2009) at Jangipur, 85.95% polling was recorded. Election Commission made elaborate arrangement for a free and fair election in all 1,530 booths of the Lok Sabha constituency. 5 ASPs, 15 DSPs and 32 inspectors and 134 companies CPF jawans were deployed.

No sooner had the voting started, than the voters started to face problems. There was no electricity at booth no.98 of Chapghati-Suti at Khudiram Das Vidyalaya and booth no. 27 of Mahisail.

The villagers of Sahebganj of Raghunathganj PS area didn't go to the booths because their demand to repair the roads weren't met. The villagers of Sadekupur residing under booth no.131, 132 and 133 of Suti, people of 5 booth areas of Nurpur and villagers of Eruali under Khargram PS area also boycotted the bypoll for similar reasons.

"Our voters couldn't cast their vote because 10 booths were captured by the Congress backed goons. Administration is a silent spectator there. But in the other places, people have cast their vote peacefully," CPI(M) district secretary, Mriganka Bhattacharya said.

"The villagers of Mukundapur at Nabagram aren't willing to cast their vote as they were protesting the murder of Hamid Sheikh," CPI(M) candidate Muzaffar Hossain said.

BJP candidate Sudhansu Biswas had no complaint. "I visited several booths and saw people casting their vote peacefully," he said.

The centre of attraction Avjit Mukherjee chose to spend the day at his Dewli's home giving interviews to the media. "I was in tension for the assembly election of Nalhati. As for this bypoll, I am sure I will win," he said.

## 'Over half of Jharkhand's mothers deliver at home'

**ALARMING** Poor road conditions and lack of proper transport are being blamed

### SURVEY REPORT



- The study was conducted among 500 pregnant women in Jharkhand. It has found out that more than half of the deliveries are done at home.
- The report has found that more than one third women prefer to go for delivery at home because they could not reach the health centres on time. And 80% could not arrange for transport to reach the centre.

**RANCHI:** A recent study by the Public Health Foundation of India (PHFI) has found out that more than half of the deliveries in Jharkhand are done at home and the reason is poor bad condition of roads and transport facility. The PHFI study conducted along with London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine and University of Aberdeen (UK), has found that one in every five women who die during delivery is from India. The study was conducted among 500 pregnant women in Jharkhand. It has found out that more than half of the deliveries are done at home. More than half of the respondents were illiterate, 95% women belonged to SC,

ST and OBC, and 85% had monthly household income which amounts to less than ₹5,000.

The report has found that more than one third women prefer to go for delivery at home

because they could not reach the health centres on time.

"Bad roads and unavailability of transport during emergency pose as forces to go for delivery at home," it reports.

However, cost of operation, fear of abuse and privacy also holds them back from going to the health center.

Jharkhand assembly speaker CP Singh said, "This survey should be an eye opener for all of us. The government should adopt new technologies to improve the situation of roads in the state." National Rural Road Development Agency's (NRRDA) report said road construction and repair work done using hot mix is often sub-standard and there is a need to use cold mix for the same.

Cold mix technology has been a success in the NE states where more than 1,500 km of road has been constructed using this technology, considered to be greener and safer and facilitates faster black-topping of roads.

## 1.8 MILLION KIDS AFFECTED IN ASSAM FLOODS

## New panel to add teeth to women's safety in J'khand

**RANCHI:** The Jharkhand Women's Commission has launched a new panel Women Power Network (WPN) in all 24 districts of Jharkhand.

The aim of the scheme is to establish a healthy partnership between the state commission, women protection cells, police stations, civil society and active NGOs in each district.

Convened by Hemlata S Mohan, chairperson of State Women's Commission, and Deepak Dey, monitoring and evaluating officer of Unicef, at the state women's commission's

office, Dhurwa, the meeting was attended by a police officer and a member of the women protection cell, each from every district.

"The WPN has to organise meetings every three months. The commission will record the obstacles that come in the way of women protection cells and women PS in maintaining law and order, and tackling women related crimes. Each district shall submit a monthly report on their work and send us in writing the problems they face. We will take up each matter with the state government," Mohan said. The WPN noted down different problems that were raised and suggested

networking as the solution.

Out of 24 districts of the state, only Ranchi had an active women helpline number. But this too is not known to most residents and remains inactive. A similar situation is in Palamu where the absence of a landline number forced the station in-charge to advertise her personal mobile number as the helpline number.

Mohan assured that necessary actions would be taken. The representatives were given a workshop on preparing a sound database of crimes, those registered and those solved, and advised to submit a monthly report on the same.

## Tribals trade their Antyodaya ration cards for liquor

**GHATSILA:** A noxious practice is prevalent in rural Ghatsila wherein the primitive tribes are being coerced to hand over their Antyodaya ration cards to local hooch dealers who use the cards to get a supply of free rice. This rice is used to brew handia or country liquor, which is given to the tribals, many of whom are alcoholic.

Many primitive tribal groups living in the pockets of Ghatsila block such as Haludboni, Ghutia, Kesarpur, Basadera, Darisai, Jhatijharna and Kani mohuli have become victims to this practice. Around 512 PTGs were issued Antyodaya cards so that they could get at least 35 kg of free rice every month.

The Sabar villagers here are very poor. The PTGs are mostly alcoholic and taking this shortcut they satisfy their craving for liquor," the village head of Ghutia Prafulla Singh said. "Also, in many

cases, ration dealers provide only 10-15 kg rice to the card holder and keep the remaining for sale. This practice is going on for years as there is no one to monitor what is happening," the village heads said. Sources said that the tribals are being exploited in other ways. Many ration dealers are asking for money to provide rice or give them part of their monthly quota. The officials are also afraid of visiting those areas to conduct an investigation fearing Maoist attack.

## HEADMASTER SELLS MID-DAY MEAL RICE

**DHANBAD:** A school headmaster was caught selling 16 quintals of rice, allotted under the mid-day meal programme, in the open market. The matter came to light during an inspection in schools.

An FIR has been lodged on Tuesday with the Jharia police station against Bharat Ram Mahto, the headmaster of Guranak Primary School, Koyaribandh under Jharia Block, on the directions of the District Superintendent of Education (DSE).

Sources said that 16 quintals of rice that was allotted to the school on October 5 from Bhaga FCI godown could not be traced in the stock. Mahto, along with a few members of Gram Shiksha Samiti, sold the bag of rice in the open market instead of bringing it to the school storeroom.

Besides this, there was a big difference in the students' attendance in the register and their actual presence in the school.

# Better late than never

The UPA is doing the right thing by taking the guesswork out of paying retrospective taxes

**T**he problem with backdating taxes is that the taxpayer will have to continuously guess how much of his current income will be taken away at a later date. This is the crux of the Parthasarathi Shome committee report on retrospective taxation of cross-border acquisition of Indian assets, like Vodafone's \$11.2 billion purchase of Hutchison's stake in the country's third largest telecom service provider in 2007. The Supreme Court in January ruled against the taxman, who was claiming as his ₹11,200 crore in tax, penalty and interest. The court conceded that Indian law was incapable of plugging a widely used tax dodge by inbound foreign investment. The message for the government in the verdict was that the law needed to be changed to curb treaty shopping, the practice of routing investments through letter-box companies in havens like Mauritius to avoid paying taxes in India. Presenting his last budget in March, the then finance minister Pranab Mukherjee, altered the Income Tax Act to tax such deals with retrospective effect. His argument was since the court felt the intent of the law was not clear, it had to be explicitly clarified for the entire past life of the Income Tax Act, which was enacted in 1962.

This last bit — that deals done earlier could be taxed — raised a chorus of protest from the investing community, and the finance ministry under P Chidambaram sought an independent review of its stand. Mr Shome, a tax expert of international standing, has now told the government what it knew all this while: taxes in retrospect are best avoided. Specifically, they must never be used to merely raise tax revenue. In the Vodafone case, the Shome committee is unequivocal: the company to claim tax from is Hutchison, which made the profit from the sale of its stake in the telecom company. Vodafone was not required by the extant law to withhold capital gains tax. Since Vodafone made no profit in the deal, the question of interest and penalties on back taxes does not arise.

Mr Chidambaram has indicated his desire to reverse the decision as soon as possible, even before the next budget when, normally, amendments to the Income Tax Act are undertaken. He reckons investors will return to the table once the fog over retrospective taxes is lifted. If India manages to block the tax loophole for future cross-border deals, it will have accomplished its main purpose. The sideshow over its retrospective impact was spilling over unnecessarily into the broader economy.

# A shot at prevention

Deadly monsoon diseases can be contained if the civic authorities perform their duties efficiently

**D**isease outbreaks that follow the monsoons each year are far more predictable than the rains. Yet, the government and civic authorities wait for several hospitalisations and more than a few deaths before declaring that they are drawing up plans to tackle the problem on what is always described as a 'war-footing'. By the time the bureaucratic offensive even starts, the war against disease is lost, along with hundreds of lives.

Almost all these deaths are preventable. Among the most deadly monsoon diseases are dengue, malaria, Japanese encephalitis (JE) and chikungunya, all of which are spread by mosquitoes that multiply in fresh standing water. If the civic authorities would just do their job of cleaning up neighbourhoods and unclogging stagnating drains, people afflicted with mosquito-borne infections would be few and far between. Simple civic measures such as not allowing rainwater to accumulate, using larvacides to kill larvae and fumigation to kill adult mosquitoes bring down new infections drastically. Routine island-wide larviciding and DDT spraying in Mauritius — a mashy, tropical island that gets some amount of rain throughout the year — coupled with tracking each malarial case to ensure that there is no re-infection helped the country eliminate local infection in 1969, and again in 1998 after it re-emerged in 1975.

The fact that there is an inexpensive and effective vaccine against JE makes its containment even easier. Yet, despite the fact that the JE vaccine is included in the routine immunisation for 35 districts of eastern Uttar Pradesh, brain fever has claimed over 400 lives in the state. This also points to the bigger health-care lacunae of routine immunisation vaccines not reaching children. Measures such as rapid diagnostic tests for an early detection of the more deadly Plasmodium falciparum malaria, along with using the chloroquine, artesunate and sulphadoxinepyrimethamine drug combination therapy in areas where the parasite is resistant to conventional anti-malarial medicines have saved lives, but prevention by far remains the most effective strategy of containing infection. For once infection starts — as the world's uncomfortably close encounters with H5N1 (bird flu) and H1N1 (swine flu) have shown — no one is safe from it.

# The game changers

As corruption grows and politics swings between the venal and bizarre, the mango people are likely to become receptive to someone who breaks from the herd

**W**hether you like Sonia Gandhi's son-in-law Robert Vadra or not, it was hard not to chortle at his spectacularly ill-timed, possibly insensitive, definitely elitist and subsequently deleted Facebook post: 'Mango people in a banana republic.'

But as Vadra's bête noir, 43-year-old Arvind Kejriwal recognises, this is the age of India's mango people, a droll literal translation of aam aadmi, the apolitical, toiling common man. Kejriwal, the face of a new party whose name you will soon hear, is someone old-school politicians should fear — if not today, then tomorrow; and if not him, someone like him.

As corruption grows and politics swings between the venal and bizarre, the mango people are likely to become increasingly receptive to someone who breaks from the herd. If you argue that India against Corruption (IAC), the movement Kejriwal founded with Gandhian Anna Hazare last year, is a fleeting, marginal urban phenomenon, you may be right. Except it was never as marginal as the pundits said or mainstream politicians hoped. Using the quintessential Indian penchant for missed calls (supporters were asked to give a missed call), the IAC's technology provider has a database of more than 20 million "unique numbers" at its computers in Mumbai, a representative of the movement tells me.

That appears insignificant in an electorate that exceeds 700 million people, but it is not a small number for something that began only last year. And those who dismiss Kejriwal as an urban, middle-class phenomenon would do well to recognise that India's elite are growing in number and influence.

An unpublished paper written by Indian Institute of Management (Bangalore) professor MV Rajeev Gowda notes that elites now decide the electoral fates of more than 100 urban constituencies, nearly a fifth of parliamentary seats. As Gowda explains, the retreat of elites from political life is a relatively recent phenomenon. They controlled the Congress party roughly till 1967, when the Green Revolution heralded the rise of the farmer, until the 1990s, when a host of formerly marginalised communities swept into politics.

The retreat of the elite — mainly the then small middle class — coincided with the decline of national parties. "This phase has been characterised by political corruption and the decline of ideology, resulting in disinterest and cynicism among elites with regard to politics," writes Gowda.

The rise in aspirations fractured politics. In 1977, parliamentary elections saw 2,439 candidates from 35 parties; by 2009, there were 8,070 candidates and 207 parties (with independents grouped as a single party), academic Devesh Kapur and researcher Milan Vaishnav calculated in a 2011 paper.

Kapur, a political science professor at the University of Pennsylvania, predicted in a previous paper that the middle class retreat from politics would be reversed as urban elites become aware of their power and reconnected with politics.

To be sure, this does not mean elites are an ethical, homogenous group in search of the messianic qualities that Mahatma Gandhi possessed and Independence-era India revered. But, overall, emerging India — elites and everyone else — is impatient for a

better politics and politicians.

As professional qualifications, integrity and experience go, it is hard to fault 'Kejri', as his friends call him. A mechanical engineer from the elite Indian Institute of Technology (IIT), Kejriwal is a former income-tax officer and an enemy of status quo. He started his battle for change while a government officer. With others, he launched 'Parivartan' (change), a citizen's movement that led public institutions in Delhi to be more transparent and responsive. In 2006, Kejriwal resigned from government service. It was the year he won the Ramon Magsaysay award, sometimes called the Asian Nobel, for his work on India's landmark Right to Information Act.

Beyond today's attention-seeking exposes, Kejriwal's 'vision document' — released this month for public discussion — offers broad, unexceptional policies: universal health care, free, "equal and quality" education, devolution of power to village councils, special attention to farmers and the destitute, more affirmative action and an end to female foeticide. Kejriwal's populist economic agenda faces ridicule from economists, but the manifesto of almost every Indian political party echoes many of these views.

Where the party breaks the mould is in its code of conduct and organisational vision. Examples: party officials and election candidates will be chosen by party workers and "local people", not by a "high command"; no official will serve more than two terms; the party's elected representatives will not yield to the trappings of power, such as cars with red lights and discretionary quotas, railway tickets and gas connections. This may sound utopian, but in an age of cynicism, that is no bad thing.

Yet, the uncompromising Kejriwal is no messiah. His plans to end corruption do not extend beyond a magical ombudsman, a Lokpal. A recent *Caravan* profile also suggests that he ignores advice from associates and tends to use people, even crowd-pullers Baba Ramdev and Anna Hazare (who had a public falling out with Kejriwal). The magazine quotes Ramdev aide Acharya Virendra Vikram: "He smartly used our platform and then turned his back at a crucial time."

"The real challenge for Kejriwal will be to find credible candidates, people who have a rapport with the public," IIM's Gowda tells me. Chairperson of IIM Bangalore's Centre for Public Policy and a long-time aspirant for a Congress ticket, Gowda is helping politicians get acquainted with the middle-class discontent that Kejriwal uncovered. This month, Gowda finished a 47-day training course for female politicians (in zilla panchayats, or local councils). The women came from 10 states and six political parties, including the Congress, BJP, NCP, Shiv Sena and Janata Dal (Secular); they learned political marketing, the power of opinion polls, agitations and how to use technology in politics. A new politics is coming, and it isn't only the mango people who think so.

# Carrying on in Caracas

Chávez's victory has ensured that the space for 21st century alternatives will grow

**T**he transformation of Latin America is one of the decisive changes reshaping the global order. The tide of progressive change that has swept the region over the last decade has brought a string of elected socialist and social-democratic governments to office that have redistributed wealth and power, rejected western neoliberal orthodoxy, and challenged imperial domination.

Central to that process has been Hugo Chávez and his Bolivarian revolution in Venezuela. Venezuela, sitting on the world's largest proven oil reserves, has spearheaded the movement of radical change across Latin America and underwritten the regional integration that is key to its renaissance. Chávez's remarkable presidential election victory recently — in which he won 55% of the vote on an 81% turnout after 14 years in power — has a significance far beyond Venezuela, or even Latin America. The stakes were enormous: if his oligarch challenger Henrique Capriles had won, not only would the revolution have come to a halt, triggering privatisations and the axing of social programmes. So would its essential

support for continental integration, mass sponsorship of Cuban doctors across the hemisphere — as well as Chávez's plans to reduce oil dependence on the US market.

Western and Latin American media and corporate elites had convinced themselves that they were at last in with a shout, that this election was 'too close to call', or that a failing Venezuelan president, weakened by cancer, would be rejected by his own people.

It's all of a piece with the endlessly recycled Orwellian canard that Chávez is some kind of a dictator and Venezuela a tyranny where elections are rigged and the media muzzled and prostrate. But as opposition leaders concede, Venezuela is by any rational standards a democracy, with exceptionally high levels of participation and its electoral process more fraud-proof than those in Britain or the US. In reality, the greatest threat to Venezuelan democracy came in the form of the abortive US-backed coup of 2002.

In the queues outside polling stations, in the opposition stronghold of San Cristóbal near the Colombian border, Capriles voters told me: "This is a democracy." Several claimed that if Chávez won, it wouldn't be because of manipulation of the voting

system but the "laziness" and "greed" of their Venezuelans - by which they mean the appeal of government social programmes.

Which gets to the heart of the reason so many got the Venezuelan election wrong. Despite claims that Latin America's progressive tide is exhausted, left-wing and centre-left governments continue to be re-elected because they have reduced poverty and inequality and taken control of energy resources to benefit the excluded majority.

That is what Chávez has been able to do on a grander scale, using Venezuela's oil income and publicly-owned enterprises to slash poverty by half and extreme poverty by 70%, massively expanding access to health and education, halving unemployment, and giving slum communities direct control over social programmes.

To visit any rally or polling station dur-

ing the election campaign was to be left in no doubt as to who Chávez represents: the poor, the non-white, the young, the disabled — the dispossessed majority who have returned him to power. Of course there is no shortage of government failures: from runaway violent crime to corruption, lack of delivery and economic diversification, and over-dependence on one man's charismatic leadership. But even so, Chávez ended up almost 11 points ahead. His re-election now gives him the chance to ensure Venezuela's transformation is deep enough to survive him, to overcome the administration's failures and help entrench the process of change across the continent.

Venezuela's revolution doesn't offer a political model that can be directly transplanted elsewhere. But its innovative social programmes, experiments in direct democracy and success in bringing resources under public control offer lessons to anyone interested in social justice and new forms of socialist politics in the rest of the world.

For all their problems and weaknesses, Venezuela and its Latin American allies have demonstrated that it's no longer necessary to accept a failed economic model, as many social democrats in Europe still do. They have shown it's possible to be both genuinely progressive and popular. Chávez's re-election has now ensured the space for 21st century alternatives will grow.

**T**he Right to Information Act (RTIA), which turns seven tomorrow, is a remarkable piece of legislation. It is lauded regularly at the international level where India has to frequently deflect attacks on its human rights records, unprogressive voting patterns and appalling social indicators. The Global Right to Information Rating, which analyses the quality of the world's access to information laws, ranks India second only to Serbia for the quality of the RTIA.

Over the last seven years, every segment of society has used it to ferret out information from the State: hungry villagers have used it to find out why their names are missing from BPL lists; corporations have had lawyers pour over government files to know why they have not got licences, and government servants, one of the most prolific users, have challenged arbitrariness within their own organisations. In many ways, the RTI can be credited for partially changing the culture of secrecy around government decision-making.

# Making our secrets public

The Right to Information Act is India's showpiece law. Yet, it faces many hurdles

The hunger for information has been feeding into the demand for meaningful public participation in decision-making. For example, in Kerala, public consultation has started on the new Kerala police law. Such initiatives are connecting people with policy-makers. This access to information has exposed scams and spurred protests. Movements like the anti-nuclear protests in Kudankulam and Anna Hazare's anti-corruption drive are encouraging discussions on our quality of governance. Uncomfortable questioning is leading to a more open and democratic governance.

But every silver cloud has a dark lining. Under the guise of amending a good law, the Centre is trying hard to keep the

shroud of secrecy intact: it tried but, thankfully, failed to remove 'file notings' from the purview of the RTIA and has used spurious logic to add departments to the exempted list on the ground of being "intelligence and security organisations". The latest to use this escape clause is the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI). But the truth is that by statute it is an anti-corruption agency, not a security institution.

To discourage people from filing RTI questions, some state governments have imposed their own rules: they have restricted the number of questions that can be asked per request and the number of words that can be used. In many cases, the application fee has been increased.

Many bureaucrats are trying to defeat the purpose of the Act by not complying with its provisions. At the level of information commissions, the Act has to contend with the uneven quality of jurisprudence, heavy arrears and the usual under-resourcing of the tribunals.

The judiciary is also not keen to come under the purview of the law. By appealing against a verdict of the high court that said that judges must declare their assets, the Supreme Court has put itself in the unenviable position of someday being accused of being a judge in its own cause. It recently insisted that only judges should head information commissions and must sit in benches. This has not helped put to bed the perception that it is only looking after itself. The verdict has brought to a halt the working of at least eight information commissions at a time when they are already facing stiff challenges: arrears, bureaucratic systems and refusals to impose penalties on erring officials.

# Reforms blitzkrieg: 44 decisions in 3 meetings

**NEW DELHI:** After three weeks of heavy-duty agenda, Thursday's meeting of the Union cabinet will see a lighter schedule with just three issues up for discussion. But one thing is likely to remain unchanged — Prime Minister Manmohan Singh's aura of assertion, which has been evident ever since he started pushing long-pending reforms through.

Singh, once blamed by political rivals for the alleged policy paralysis, led the last cabinet meeting to take 18 decisions in just one-and-a-half hours. The cabinet committee on economic affairs (CCEA) approved five items in 30 minutes while the cabinet committee on infrastructure (CCI) decided three

in 15. The cabinet, CCEA and CCI cleared 44 proposals after just three meetings.

The cabinet committee on political affairs took barely 20 minutes to decide on the sensitive issue of reducing LPG and diesel subsidy.

"He believes in building consensus. At times, he asks for the opinion of senior ministers. But realising the need for clearing proposals, he often intervenes to ensure that the debate doesn't consume too much time," a senior cabinet minister said.

In a recent cabinet meeting, Singh reportedly cut short the

speech of rural development minister Jairam Ramesh to allow finance minister P Chidambaram to speak on the issue. On another occasion, he reportedly overruled senior minister Vayalar Ravi and approved a proposal.

In the October 4 cabinet meeting, where 18 proposals were cleared, the PM ensured that discussions don't hold up other items listed for the day.

Insurance laws amendment was the 12th item on the list, while pension fund amendments, the company bill and forward contracts regulation bill were the 13th, 15th and 17th items respectively. "As a lot of ground work had already been done on these issues, the items were virtually cleared without major discussion," a senior minister said.

## Advantage Lalu as black flags dot Nitish rallies

**PATNA:** The seven-year itch with the Nitish Kumar government appears to have begun in Bihar. Black seems to be its favourite colour — especially when greeting the CM on his adhikar yatra. Simultaneously, crowds are swelling at the parivartan yatra of Lalu Prasad — whose RJD enjoyed a 15-year stint in the state.

The winds of change have already blown away Kumar's rallying cry — special status for the state. Very much on the backfoot, he is now talking of the "mistrule of the Lalu-Rabri regime", something he had only done back in 2005, while seeking a mandate from Bihar.

The government's crackdown also shows in the crackdown against the protesters at the CM's rallies — mostly "fixed pay" teachers demanding "prescribed pay scale".

After the violence in Khagaria on September 27, teachers were arrested and diversions organised — painting competitions and special meetings — to keep them busy elsewhere. To keep the black flags away, the government even banned "anything black" at the rallies. "What about black hair? Are they going to get people to shave their heads too?" quipped Lalu to cheers from the audience.

The RJD sounds almost smug. Its change of fortune comes after a triple rout. Voted out of power in 2005, it got steamrolled in the 2009 Lok Sabha polls, winning just four of the 40 seats. And (un)relenting, the people gave it only 22 of the 243 assembly seats in 2010.

Party spokesperson Ram Kripal Yadav ascribes the good times to the government's faux pas, like "failure to deliver on promises and repressive measures adopted against protesters". As for the "repressive measures", not all his leaders seem to be on the same page with Kumar's administration. JD(U) MP and national spokesperson Shivanand Tiwari believes the measures are counter-productive.

But does he think the seven-year itch will translate to a divorce? "I don't think all this presages a comeback by Lalu Prasad," he said. "When time comes to vote, people will opt for one with fewer flaws. That's when Nitish Kumar will score".

## KEJRIWAL GOES AFTER HARYANA LAND DEAL, ALL GUNS BLAZING

**NEW DELHI:** The Arvind Kejriwal-led India Against Corruption (IAC) on Wednesday questioned the Haryana government's statement that it did not transfer 30 acres of land, meant for constructing a hospital, to real estate company DLF for using it as a special economic zone (SEZ).

The Haryana government had denied the charge leveled by Kejriwal on Tuesday. "No land meant for setting up a hospital was released in favour of DLF in 2007, as was alleged by Mr Kejriwal...The land being talked about was released in favour of East India Hotels Ltd in 1995 following six years of court proceedings. No release of land has been done during the last 10 years," the Haryana government stated.

Kejriwal, however, questioned the state government's version. "This raises suspicions on the Haryana government's intention, as to why it did not take any action against the company that failed to construct the hospital for 16 years..."

He also raised questions over the state government allowing East India Hotels Ltd to sell the land to DLF. "Who allowed the change in use of land? Can anybody other than the government do it? The (Haryana government's) response... is clearly a bunch of lies," Kejriwal said.

Haryana government is likely to respond to Kejriwal's latest charge on Thursday.

### PLAN TO PICKET SONIA'S HOUSE

Arvind Kejriwal, accompanied by several differently abled IAC activists, is likely to gherao the residence of Congress president Sonia Gandhi on Friday to demand the resignation of law minister Salman Khurshid. It has been alleged that an NGO run by Khurshid and his wife indulged in financial irregularities. "Money bungling in an NGO floated by the law minister's wife is a matter of shame," Kejriwal said.

Khurshid's wife Louise, project director of the Dr Zakir Hussain Memorial Trust, denied the allegations leveled in a sting operation carried out by a news channel. "The allegations are malicious and baseless... A legal notice is being sent, and appropriate proceedings in accordance with the law will be initiated," she said in a statement.

# SGPC honours kin of Vaidya's killers

**AMRITSAR/NEW DELHI:** As the Centre made it clear on Tuesday that it would not interfere in the construction of a memorial in the Golden Temple for those who died in Operation Bluestar, the Shiromani Gurdwara Parbandhak Committee (SGPC) bestowed special honours on the families of assassins Harjinder Singh Jinda and Sukhdev Singh Sukha.

Jinda and Sukha had assassinated General Arun Vaidya — in-charge of the 1984 Operation Bluestar — in 1986. He was killed in Pune, where he was residing after retirement.

The two were hanged in 1992 and the SGPC has been observing their death anniversaries since 1993.

On Tuesday, to mark their 19th death anniversary, the SGPC performed 'bhog' and Akhand Path at the Harmandir Sahib complex. Jinda's brother Bhupinder Singh and Sukha's relative Surjit Kaur were presented with "siropas".

But despite the presence of SGPC secretary Dalmegh Singh, the function was muted, unlike the ones held at the Golden Temple in the late '80s and early '90s.

Another function was held at village Gadli in Amritsar district

— the home of Jinda, who was a member of the Khalistan commando force. There too, only a handful of villagers and relatives were present.

In Delhi, meanwhile, Union home minister Sushilkumar Shinde said the government would not interfere in the SGPC's construction at the Golden Temple in the light of the rights bestowed by the Constitution.

"It is a matter of rights given to organisations by the Constitution. It is their institution and we cannot interfere unless somebody takes objection in a court," he said.

Shinde, however, added that the country has suffered due to terrorism for years and therefore, "the people should introspect".

The controversial memorial comes in the backdrop of intelligence reports about attempts to revive militancy in Punjab. Shinde said the government had information about "some activities" in Punjab and other countries.

# Shouldn't allow radicals to glorify militant ideology

On September 30, Lt Gen Kuldip Singh Brar (ret'd) — the lone surviving frontline commander of Operation Bluestar — escaped an assassination bid in London by knife-wielding Sikh radicals out to avenge the army action. In a wide-ranging interview with HT at his residence in Mumbai on Monday, he defended Operation Bluestar and opposed the upcoming memorial at Harmandir Sahib, while making a passionate pitch for healing the wounds of the past. Excerpts:

**It's been 28 years since Operation Bluestar, and Punjab has long moved on. What do you make of the attack on you now?**  
Well, Punjab has adopted the path of peace. A majority of its people don't want to revert to the conditions that existed in the 1980s. Unfortunately, there are pro-Khalistan groups very active abroad, particularly in London, Canada and Germany.

**But, 1984 still rankles the collective psyche of Sikhs?**  
A large section of the Sikh community has put Operation Bluestar behind. But, if you allow radicals to glorify the militant ideology by building a memorial to that event inside Harmandir Sahib, it wouldn't take long for that section to get smaller, and some of them to get on to the side of radicals.

**Do you mean radicals can destabilise Punjab?**  
It depends on how these radicals are able to influence the larger section that wants peace. The attack on me was carried out by people in the age group of 32 to 35 years. They were kids when Bluestar happened. What do they know about it? Obviously, they were emotionally charged by senior radicals who told them to "go ahead and carry out this task".

**Do you see any connection between the attack on**

**you and the upcoming memorial in the Golden Temple?**  
It may not have anything to do with the memorial, but such memorials should never be allowed to come up.

**The SGPC says the memorial is for innocents killed during the army action.**  
A majority of them were terrorists or militants. There are other ways to remember those who died, but not by raising a memorial in Harmandir Sahib. It's time to heal the wounds of the past.

## RUSSIA TO GIVE AIRCRAFT CARRIER TO INDIA

**NEW DELHI:** Russia on Wednesday assured India that it will hand over the aircraft carrier Admiral Gorshkov to it by the end of next year, after New Delhi conveyed its concern over the prolonged delay. The assurance came during a meeting between defence minister AK Antony and his Russian counterpart Anatoly Serdyukov. Russia also sought to dispel the impression of its proximity to Pakistan over arms supplies, saying there was no change in its policy in this regard.

**NHRC organises seminar on World Mental Health Day**  
**NEW DELHI:** Blaming increase in depression and stress-related mental diseases on rapid changes in lifestyle, National Human Rights Commission (NHRC) chairperson Justice KG Balakrishnan on Wednesday emphasised the need for trained medical professionals and hospitals. Balakrishnan made the observation at a seminar titled 'Human Rights and Mental Health Care' organised by NHRC to mark the World Mental Health Day.

**Woman officer wins case, promoted to captain**  
**CHANDIGARH:** The Armed Forces Tribunal (AFT) in Chandigarh on Wednesday ordered the promotion of acting major Jasreen Dhillon who had challenged the non-implementation of AV Singh Committee report. The report said an officer would become a captain in two years, but the army had refused it for Service Commissioned (SSC) women officers who, they said, could become captains only after five years. Dhillon submitted that SSC officers should be granted promotions at par with permanent commissioned officers.

**HC issues notice to Punjab government on school donation**  
**CHANDIGARH:** The Punjab and Haryana High Court on Wednesday issued notice to Punjab government seeking explanation for ₹1 crore donation by deputy chief minister Sukhbir Singh Badal to his alma mater Lawrence School in Himachal Pradesh. The bench heard a plea by former Congress MLA Sukhpal Singh Khaira who alleged that the grant to the boarding school was given from the Punjab Nirman Funds while schools in Punjab were ignored.

**Fake stamp paper scam accused given 7 years imprisonment**  
**NEW DELHI:** A Delhi court on Wednesday upheld seven years of imprisonment given to Abdul Karim Telgi in the multi-crore fake stamp paper scam. Telgi, who is a HIV/AIDS patient, had challenged the trial court judgment sentencing him to seven years in jail and the fine of ₹25 lakh saying he had already spent time in jail. The additional sessions judge refused to reduce the fine amount saying it was a huge loss to the Indian economy and consequently the fine cannot be said to be excessive.

**SC upholds common medical entrance test for all colleges**  
**NEW DELHI:** The Supreme Court on Wednesday refused to stay the national eligibility-cum-entrance test for postgraduate medical courses (NEET-PG) to be held for the first time in November. On petitions filed by 26 colleges, an apex court bench refused to grant an interim order permitting the institutions to conduct their own entrance examination. The colleges challenged NEET-PG on grounds that minority institutions should be exempted from the common test.

**BJP likely to boycott today's JPC meet on 26**  
**NEW DELHI:** BJP is likely to boycott the proceedings of the joint parliamentary committee on Thursday over the issue of calling Prime Minister Manmohan Singh and finance minister P Chidambaram as witnesses in the 2G case. A BJP member said there was no relevance in the meeting where former additional secretary of the department of economic affairs Sindhushree Khullar will be coming. The six BJP members in JPC had asked the panel chief to take a final decision on calling Singh and Chidambaram before the committee.

**Mob of angry women lynches 'molester' in Nagpur**  
**NAGPUR:** In a late night drama, a group of around 500 people, most of them women, lynched a notorious goon after chasing him for half a kilometre, on Tuesday. The goon, Iqbal Sheikh, (26) used to harass, molest and sexually exploit the women of Vasantrao Naik slum in west Nagpur locality. The infuriated women alleged that Iqbal had made their life hell and forced them to live under constant fear. The women's violent act of vengeance brought back memories of the infamous Akku Yadav killing case of Nagpur who was similarly hanged to death by a group of women on the court premises a few years ago.

**Leopard kills boy in Raipur**  
**RAIPUR:** Panic gripped at tiny Tika village in the Pithora forest range in Chhattisgarh's Mahasamund district after a leopard reportedly killed a seven-year-old boy. Rajesh Yadav disappeared on Monday evening. A search for the child led villagers to the torn and blood-stained trousers of the victim near a forested hill on Tuesday. Confirming that the child was killed by a man-eater, Mahasamund divisional forest officer announced compensation of ₹2 lakh to the deceased's family.

# Pregnant woman raped in Haryana

**KAITHAL:** A five-month pregnant married Dalit woman, 19, was allegedly abducted and raped by two men in northern Haryana's Kaithal district, leaving the state reeling under the impact of the 15th reported sexual assault on its women within a month.

The incident came to light on Wednesday, a day after Congress president Sonia Gandhi visited the family of a 15-year-old rape victim in Jind district who committed suicide.

Kaithal police have arrested the two accused, Rakesh and Pawan, on the woman's complaint, said district superintendent of police Kuldeep Singh.

According to the woman, the accused abducted her around 4am on Tuesday when she had gone out of her house to answer nature's call.

Singh said, "Investigation has revealed a call was made from the woman's phone to accused Rakesh at 3.20am on Tuesday. The call details and other evidence will be placed in court."

The series of rapes have raised a political storm in Haryana, where the powerful khaps have suggested lowering the marriageable age of boys and girls to 16 years to curb incidents of sexual assault.

On Tuesday, Gandhi had taken on the khaps, saying law was solely in the hands of the judiciary. Former Haryana chief minister and INLD leader Om Prakash Chautla, however, supported the khap panchayats' suggestion on Wednesday, citing a Mughal-era practice.

"The Mughal sultanate in this country used to misbehave with women... to prevent that, people started getting their young girls married early so that no one did anything wrong to them... currently a similar situation is arising in the state."

In Delhi, Union home minister Sushilkumar Shinde said the Centre was monitoring the situation in Haryana.

# Gangraped, 35-yr-old sets herself on fire, dies

**BHOPAL:** A 35-year-old woman committed suicide after she was allegedly gangraped in Raisen district, Madhya Pradesh, the police said on Wednesday.

The woman was picked up by four persons in a jeep on Tuesday who allegedly raped her in Badi forest area and dumped her on the road. The victim somehow returned home,

set herself on fire and sustained serious burn injuries to which she succumbed on late Tuesday night.

In her dying declaration, the woman blamed four persons for driving her to commit suicide, but failed to identify them.

She told the police that while returning home she was forcefully taken away by four men who allegedly gangraped her. A case has been registered against unidentified persons.

# Khaph panchayats back in spotlight of notoriety

**NEW DELHI:** With some members of Haryana khaph panchayats saying that lowering the age for marriage could be the solution to crimes such as rape, the clan councils have come in the eye of storm once again. The clan councils "remedy", which has shocked many, comes at a time when Haryana is being rocked by incidents of sexual assault.

In his book 'Rivalry and Brotherhood', sociologist Dipankar Gupta says that khaps — a traditional institution found among castes such as Jats and Gujars in Haryana and parts of west UP — are similar to gotras, sub-groups within a caste that claim to have descended from a common ancestor.

This could be the reason for their compulsive exogamy, pro-

hibiting marriage within the same clan because any such act is considered akin to incest.

The main difference between the khaps of northwestern India and the institution of gotra, which is found elsewhere, is that khaps have chaudharis and panchayats. Their age-old mechanism to punish violations places them at ideological odds with modern law.

Gupta said as many as 384 khaps exist among Jats alone. With khaps taking pride in their "martial traditions", there is perpetual fear of violence in their areas. Although the social influ-

ence of khaps makes even the Haryana government go soft on them, the latest prescription on marriageable age goes against the Hindu Marriage Act as well as the Prohibition of Child Marriage Act. "The government should crush the khaps' powers," asserts Colin Gonsalves, a lawyer.

Gupta has also documented how, in 1993, a sarv khap (all-khap) panchayat in Sonapat village "resolved that divorce should be considered a social crime, and the offending party should be ostracised by the village".

But khaps view their own role as socially positive, often passing "reformist" resolutions. The 1993 sarv khap panchayat, which had ruled against divorce, also ruled against extravagant marriages and alcoholism, and advocated education for girls. Historian Prem Chowdhry documents such resolutions back to 1974 and 1930.

New firm to build expressways on the cards

EASIER AND FASTER NEXCOR to fast-track development of road network, raise resources and deploy funds

NEW DELHI: In order to speed up the development of expressways in India, the government plans to set up a new company — National Expressways and Connectivity Corporation (NEXCOR) — under the ministry of road transport and highways.

The 11th Five-Year Plan had stated that the government would consider establishing an Expressway Authority of India to formulate and implement a master plan for building 15,600 km of access-controlled expressways for high-density corridors at an estimated cost of ₹156,000 crore. (The cost of developing highways/expressways is an estimated ₹10 crore per km.)

Besides, the government also plans to acquire the land for 6,000 km and expedite construction of 1,000 km of expressways under the National Highways Development Project (NHDP) Phase VI to provide for unhindered and high-speed traffic. Progress on the actual implementation of expressways has been extremely poor so far. While under NHDP-VI, feasibility studies were to be completed by 2008, land acquisition was to be done by 2009 and projects were to be awarded by 2010. However, the study has so far been completed only in the

"The objective of setting up the proposed company under Company Act 1956 is to have an alternative delivery mechanism for the development of expressways," said a government official. The proposed company would formulate a framework for development of such expressways in India, said the official. "NEXCOR will look into planning, building, operation and management of

expressways besides facilitating development of associated Urban Infrastructure along the expressways." Raising resources from the government, bilateral and multi-lateral funding agencies, and deployment of funds will also be the responsibility of the proposed company. The company would also set up special purpose vehicles (SPVs) either individually or in joint venture with state governments.

Missed out on rally? Stay in, but with long term in mind

MUMBAI: Mutual fund investors who missed out on the market rally in the last one month as they exited early to limit losses, can still re-enter, but with long-term gains in mind, say experts.

The Sensex has given around 25% return since January 2012. Retail investors should not just enter the market because it is performing or exit when it is under-performing in the short term, say analysts. "There is a behaviour gap between investor and investment that is caused by emotions, when retail investors exit at any correction and flock back when there is any rise (in markets)," said Amar Pandit, a Mumbai-based financial planner. "Investors should realise that they would gain more by staying in the market in the long term."

Sharp cut in auto growth forecast

MUMBAI: Amid a decline in car sales for two consecutive months, the Society of Indian Automobile Manufacturers (SIAM) on Wednesday lowered its full-year growth forecast to 1-3% from 9-11% announced in July. Auto sales fell by 9.4% in September, the steepest fall since December 2008. Car sales dropped 5.4% during the month to 157,536 units in September compared to 166,464

units in the year-ago period. "This trend is likely to continue until the economy comes back on track," said S Sandilya, president, SIAM.

Reflecting subdued consumer sentiments, motorcycle sales slumped 18.9%, forcing SIAM to lower growth estimate for the segment to 5-7% from 11-13%.

Commercial vehicle sales were flat, although medium and heavy truck segment continued to show decline due to slow industrial activity. Commercial vehicle sales are estimated to grow 3-5%, down

from 6-8%. Three-wheeler sales were also flat while automobile exports contracted 5.96%.

According to analysts, not just economic factors, but growing customer preference for utility vehicles has led to the drop in car sales. Utility vehicles have had a good run so far this year with 55% growth.

RC Bhargava, chairman, Maruti Suzuki, said car sales will pick up. "There will be 5% growth in the second half. The sentiment will improve because of reform measures," he said.

India a key global player, says Bernanke after banking talks with RBI governor

MUMBAI: India is becoming a key player in the global economy, US Federal Reserve chairman Ben Bernanke said on Wednesday after a meeting with Reserve Bank of India (RBI) governor D Subbarao.

"India is clearly becoming a more and more important player on the world stage, in the G20 context, in terms of its role in the global economy and I think it's very useful for us to continue to exchange ideas and build the basis for a future collaboration," said Bernanke. "We discussed monetary policy and regulatory challenges, banking issues, the global economy," he added.

Describing his first-ever visit as "very constructive", which also makes him the first US Fed chair-

Both Geithner and Bernanke met Indian industry leaders in the morning and discussed various economic issues, including

the latest round of reforms by the Indian government. "We got briefed by both on the US economic situation," said Adi Godrej, president, Confederation of Indian Industry (CII) and chairman, Godrej group.

Microsoft strategy now mimics Apple, Ballmer memo reveals

LONDON: Microsoft Corp chief executive Steve Ballmer has signalled a new direction for the world's largest software company, pointing to hardware and online services as its future, taking a page from long-time rival Apple Inc.

Ballmer's comments in his annual letter to shareholders suggested that Microsoft may eventually make its own phones to build on its forthcoming own-brand Surface tablet PC and market-leading Xbox gaming console. "There will be times when we build specific devices for specific purposes, as we have chosen to do with Xbox and the recently announced Microsoft Surface," wrote Ballmer. The new approach mimics Apple Inc, whose massively successful iPhone and iPad demonstrated tight integration of high-quality software and hardware and made Windows devices feel clunky in comparison.

BONUS CLIPPED

Alongside the shareholders' letter, Microsoft's annual proxy filing, showed that Ballmer, got a lower bonus than he did last year, partly for flat sales of Windows and his failure to ensure that the company provided a choice of browser to some European customers.

He earned a bonus of \$620,000 for Microsoft's 2012 fiscal year, which ended in June, down 9% from the year before.

His salary, which is low by US standards for chief executives, remained essentially flat at \$685,000.

EADS, BAE CALL OFF MERGER ATTEMPT

LONDON: EADS and BAE Systems will not extend their merger talks later on Wednesday, calling an end, for now, to a plan to create the world's largest defence and aerospace group.

With Germany opposing it, France's EADS and the UK's BAE Systems were in a race against time to declare their intentions and either scrap the merger, ask UK regulators for time or go ahead with their plans to create a group employing about 220,000 people.

BAE said on Wednesday that it had become clear that the interests of the French, British and German governments could not be adequately reconciled with each other or with the objectives that BAE and EADS established for the merger.

"BAE Systems and EADS have therefore decided it is in the best interests of their companies and shareholders to terminate the discussions and to continue to focus on delivering their respective strategies," it said. German Chancellor Angela Merkel had opposed the proposal to combine Airbus passenger airplanes with UK defence contractor BAE. "Merkel is against the deal but has not given reasons," a source said. **REUTERS**

## Afghan bounty on anti-Islam filmmaker

A religious figure in western Afghanistan is offering a \$300,000 bounty to anyone who kills the maker of an anti-Islam film that has angered Muslims around the world. The bounty is being offered by Mir Farooq Hussini, the spokesman for an organization representing about 450 religious schools in Herat province.

The film, made in the US, portrays Islam's Prophet Muhammad as a fraud, womanizer and child molester. Hussini told AP on Wednesday that he also is offering a \$500,000 reward for the killing of a cleric in Yazd province in neighboring Iran who has allegedly insulted the prophet's wife.

# IMF focus on US-Europe recovery

TOKYO: There is a wait-and-see approach among top officials the IMF. Wait and see what happens next in Europe and wait and see how the US tackles its so-called fiscal cliff.

Optimists at the top of the organisation believe an agreement on closer co-operation and debt sharing in Europe, alongside a congressional deal in the US to limit the impact of tax rises and spending cuts due in January, is possible and will put the world economy back on a path to growth and recovery.

Oliver Blanchard, the IMF's chief economist, singled out Europe and the US for criticism during the conference in Tokyo, though as an optimist, he said there were signs that both were edging towards deals that would end the current uncertainty.

## Aid for emerging economies

Finding ways to boost the global economy and helping poor nations fend off financial shocks will be on the agenda of the IMF and World Bank meetings. Tokyo meetings were supposed to usher in governance reforms passed two years ago, amid calls from emerging nations, including India, for a greater say in the IMF's affairs.

has made efforts to develop a more rounded economy and bigger welfare state, Beijing depends on foreign buyers for its income.

Yet the debts run up by Europe and the US since the financial crash leave them in a position where conventional wisdom says they must favour government spending cuts over measures to spur growth. The IMF said his deputy, Yi Gang, will represent him at the meeting and will deliver Sunday's lecture. The IMF couldn't confirm that Finance Minister Xie Xuren had also cancelled his trip. China's finance ministry did not respond to requests for comment.

PARIS: Former IMF chief Dominique Strauss-Kahn has pleaded to be left alone and says he is facing a "media assault" in an interview with French weekly Le Point. "I have never been convicted, not in (France) nor in any other country," he said in the interview.

"Therefore nothing justifies my being the object of a media assault that some days resembles a manhunt." Strauss-Kahn, a one-time contender for the French presidency, suffered a stunning fall from grace following his arrest at a New York hotel on sexual assault charges last year and a subsequent string of sex-related investigations in France.

In the interview, he denounced the media scrutiny he has faced since returning to France after the US charges were dropped. "I can no longer tolerate that there is an assumed right to take advantage of my situation — and the probes wrongly targeting me — to trample on my privacy," he said. "Leave me alone!"

# US scientists win Nobel for Chemistry

STOCKHOLM: Two American researchers won the Nobel Prize in Chemistry Wednesday for studies of protein receptors that let body cells sense and respond to outside signals like danger or the flavor of food. Such studies are key for developing better drugs.

The Royal Swedish Academy of Sciences said Robert Lefkowitz and Brian Kobilka had made groundbreaking discoveries, mainly in the 1980s, on an important family of receptors, known as G-protein-coupled receptors.

"They work as a gateway to the cell," Lefkowitz told a news conference in Stockholm by phone. Lefkowitz, 69, is an investigator at the Howard Hughes Medical Institute and professor at Duke University Medical Center in Durham.

Kobilka, 57, worked for Lefkowitz at Duke before transferring to Stanford University School of Medicine in California, where he is now a professor.

LONDON: The much-touted health benefits associated with super-food such as broccoli and blueberries do not reach past the gut, a new study has found.

Super-food may have been the mainstay of the health industry for a long time, but now researchers are questioning their much promised health promoting properties.

Researchers at London's Kingston University used an approach that allows them to delve deeper into the effectiveness of health-promoting 'super foods' and their elixir-giving ilk.

They found that foods such as broccoli, blueberries and whole grains do contain polyphenols — compounds that have antioxidant and anti-inflammatory properties — but they seldom make it past the gut.

"Polyphenols may well work when cells are exposed to them directly, such as under laboratory conditions, but what needs to be established is how effective they are when consumed when consumed

**NEW DELHI:** When CLT20 was conceived back in 2008, the idea was to build it up into an event as glitzy as the Champions League — the blue riband football property.

Five years down the line, the CLT20 is as far away from its goal as it was at the time of its conception. The tournament, co-hosted by the Board of Control for Cricket in India, Cricket Australia and Cricket South Africa, is struggling to find its feet, with spectators yet to show the desired level of enthusiasm.

"The reason why CLT20 has failed to get the desired response is that India already has a hugely popular tournament in IPL (Indian Premier League). Nothing comes even close to it. So it makes sense to hold it outside India where it doesn't have to compete with the IPL," said an IPL team official, requesting anonymity.

Be that as it may, can the tournament escape the accusation of not providing a level playing field to all participating nations? While the fourth ranked IPL team gets a direct entry into the main draw, the champion teams from West Indies, New Zealand, England and Pakistan have to compete in a qualifier. Then, the IPL teams, on the strength of their financial muscle, also get to snatch away

players from others teams for the tournament.

"It's true that CLT20 is getting crowded with IPL teams. And it's obviously being done to cash in on the popularity of these teams. But then it's equally true that domestic champions of the invited teams from Sri Lanka, Pakistan or New Zealand are not good enough to give top teams a run for their money. If you cut down on the IPL teams and include teams from these countries, the competition will become lop-sided," he said. "We could hope for more fair representation in the future if the club culture catches up in these countries. Then they could send stronger teams to the competition."

While this argument could still be debated, the invited countries are too happy to just be there to bother about the principle of fairness.

"It's the tournament organised by the BCCI (CA and CSA) and they are kind enough to give opportunity to others. And whatever changes are made to the format of the tournament, it's just to make it much better, there's absolutely nothing wrong with it," said Sri Lanka Cricket president Upali Dharmadasa.

With a team standing to collect \$200,000 for just qualifying, there can't much to complain.

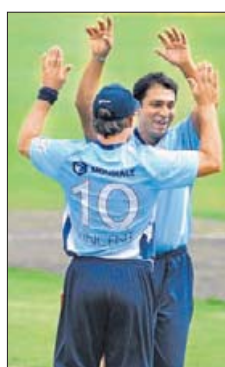

**KOLKATA:** The Sports Authority of India (SAI) has decided to stop funding of cuesport because it is not part of the Asian Games and the Olympics.

"We wish to inform you that we have received a letter from Sports Authority of India, New Delhi stating that all future funding to cuesport will be stopped because we are not part of Asian Games or the Olympic Games," said S Balasubramaniam, the secretary of the Billiards and Snooker Federation of India (BSFI), in a release on Wednesday.

Cuesport has been dropped from the 2014 Asian Games in Incheon, South Korea and from next year's Asian Indoor Games for 2013.

According to Balasubramaniam, the BSFI has pending funds that would last till the World Billiards Championships which will be held in Leeds, England from October 18 to 28. But generating funds for the World Snooker Championships to be held in Sofia, Bulgaria, from November 24 to December 2 would be a problem.

"This will affect the sport badly. It's going to be hard for us to function without these funds. We have forwarded the mail to players as well and I'm sure they are taking it hard. Especially, the guys who were supposed to be going to Bulgaria for the World Snooker Championship will face problems," said Balasubramaniam. India have won 29 world titles, 12 Asian titles and 15 medals in four Asian Games.

**TOKYO:** Football may be in Usain Bolt's future. The Olympic great said Wednesday he might try his hand at the global game once he retires from the track.

"I have said I wanted to try football," said Bolt, the world-record holder at both 100 and 200 meters. "I always wanted to try to play soccer. Maybe at the end of my career. It would be something that I would love to try. I watch it on TV and see

these guys play. I play it all the time with my friends. I played childhood matches in Jamaica and I did well. I think it is something I would like to try to do."

Two days after saying he would like to defend his 100 and 200 meter titles at the 2016 Olympics in Rio de Janeiro, the 26-year-old Bolt said he may still branch out to other track events.

"To find something else to strive toward," he said about his future goals. "I could always try the 400 meters - which I don't want to do. I

could try to run faster over both my events. I could try another event, maybe the long jump or the 400 meters. There are a few things I would like to try in sports that I could work towards. We'll see what I decide at the start of the season."

After becoming the first man to defend both 100 and 200-meter titles at the Olympics, Bolt said his once he returned home to Jamaica. "It's a great thing to achieve a goal you always wanted," Bolt said.

# McIlroy hopes to tame Tiger

**BELEK, TURKEY:** World No.1 Rory McIlroy's World Golf Final showdown with 14-times major winner Tiger Woods was put on hold after play was abandoned due to storms on Wednesday.

McIlroy without a win from two matches in the inaugural event after his latest defeat at the hands of 2011 US Masters champion and group pacesetter Charl Schwartzel is bottom of his pool with Woods and Matt Kuchar on one win apiece. Woods carded a four-under 67 to beat compatriot Kuchar by five shots before the afternoon matches were put back to Thursday when a fierce electrical storm began lashing the course.

McIlroy who lost to South African Schwartzel by one shot said he was determined to put up a better show against Woods after his level-par round.

"I don't have much to play for so I would like to beat him so he doesn't go through to the semi-finals and also get some bragging rights," McIlroy, unaware he could make the semi-finals, told reporters.

If players finish level on points qualification is decided by aggregate totals over the three rounds, with McIlroy currently on five-over-par compared to Woods at five-under and Kuchar on even par.

"Bragging rights from this week will help a little bit," added the US PGA Champion who is looking forward to a rivalry with Woods next year.

"Of course, there is always an added edge when you play against a player like Tiger and there were a few chances this year when we could have gone head-to-head in the bigger tournaments but it didn't quite happen.

# GM norms for Mhamal and Dhopade

**KOLKATA:** Goa's Anurag Mhamal had a simple solution to the problem of inadequate coaches or quality chess players in his state. He got on the information highway. "It is easy if you go on-line," said the 17-year-old after the ninth round of the Tata 50th National Premier Chess Championship here on Wednesday.

Mhamal needed a win against the promising IM Sahaj Grover for his first GM norm. With the flourish usually associated with Dempo, Goa's most successful football team — they also share the same benefactor — Mhamal crushed Grover with an English Opening to stay within a point of sole leader MR Venkatesh (7) who drew on the top board with GM Deep Sengupta.

"I had come here hoping to get my first IM norm, having missed that in Spain earlier in the year. I started off well, beating Deep Sengupta (Elo 2539) and today (Wednesday), I came looking for a win.

"I had already sealed an IM norm so I really had nothing to lose. He (Grover) made a mistake in the middle game. Also, he got into time trouble and couldn't defend well," said Mhamal who was six when he got hooked to chess watching his father play.

For the past four months, Mhamal's been coached by GM Praveen Thipsay and his target is to get the IM title by year-end. Asked how he manages to balance academics and chess, the Class II student said it was getting difficult with science subjects and so he switched to commerce.

Goa corporate giants Dempo

has been backing him for the past year-and-a-half with an annual fund of Rs 8 lakh, he said. Like most teenagers here, Mhamal said he swears by world No. 1 Magnus Carlsen.

"He loves to attack and plays some really sharp lines. Among the old-timers it will have to be (Bobby) Fischer." What about world champion Viswanathan Anand?

"He isn't that sharp." The city's been lucky for him, Mhamal said, because it was here in 2009 that he qualified for his first National A meet, this tournament in its earlier avatar.

Another player for whom this city has been lucky is IM Swapnil Dhopade who too got his maiden GM norm with a draw against GM Abhijit Kunte and is still unbeaten here. Dhopade won a tournament here this year.

Parents of this national U-25 champion realised his potential when as a Class 5 student in Amravati, Dhopade won a tournament in his school. "We didn't even know he played chess then," said father Sunil Dhopade, a health inspector with the Amravati Municipal Corporation here.

For the next six years, Dhopade senior took his son to train under OP Kakra "four-five days a week every evening from 9pm to 1am."

Dhopade, 22, is now with Central Railways and trains under GM RB Ramesh. He will play next week's international GM Open tournament in Nagpur, his father said.

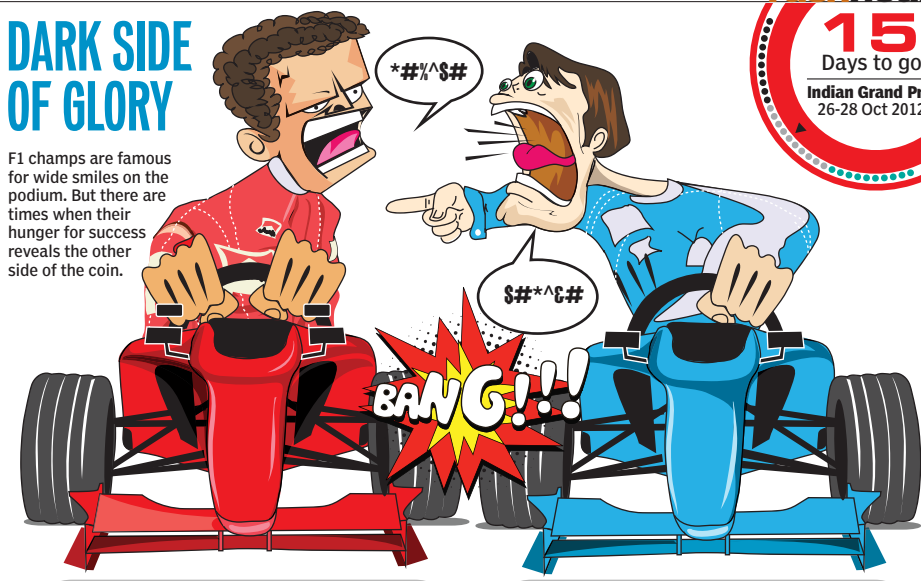

## Honda open to Formula 1 return

**NEW DELHI:** Japanese car manufacturing giant Honda has expressed its interest of returning to Formula 1 in the future.

Speaking to British motoring magazine *Autocar*, Yoshiharu Yamamoto, a senior Honda board member who is CEO of Honda R&D, said that he is keen on getting the company back to the sport that it left in 2008 following the global economic crisis that left the company unable to justify its investment in its F1

project.

Honda competed in F1 as a factory team from 1964 to 1968, winning three races, before withdrawing and returning as an engine supplier in 1984.

As a partner with Williams and then McLaren, Honda won six consecutive constructors' titles from 1986 to 1991 and five consecutive drivers' titles from 1987 to 1991.

Following another withdrawal after 1992, Honda officially returned as an engine manufacturer with the British American Racing team in 2000.

It took over the team in 2006, renaming it the Honda Racing F1 team and won the Hungarian Grand Prix.

Yamamoto went on to say that Honda's current priority was to compete in the World Touring Car Championship after which the feasibility of a return to F1 will be evaluated.

The 2014 engine regulations that will see F1 adopt 1.6-litre, turbocharged V-6 engines in place of the current 2.4-litre, V-8 engines are believed to be a draw for car manufacturers looking to compete in F1.

# Armstrong saga concluding soon?



## DOPING DRAMA USADA to seal champion cyclist's fate later this week

**AUSTIN, TEXAS:** The world may soon know what the US Anti-Doping Agency (USADA) has on Lance Armstrong.

In August, USADA ordered the results from 14 years of Armstrong's career erased, including his seven Tour de France titles, and banned him from cycling for life because of the doping case against him.

It is planning within days to send a report detailing its "reasoned decision" to the International Cycling Union, the

sport's governing body.

The document is widely anticipated because USADA is expected to include detailed evidence — including witness names and specific allegations — that USADA said it had when it charged Armstrong with performance-enhancing drug use while winning the Tour every year from 1999-2005.

Cycling authorities who backed Armstrong's legal fight to block the case have said they want to see the material before deciding whether to appeal the American agency's sanctions to the world Court of Arbitration for Sport.

## DOSSIER DE LANCE

When Lance Armstrong (right) was stripped of his 14 major titles in August, the decision threw more questions than answers in the public domain. Here are some snippets about what could happen in near future

**EVIDENCE THE REPORT WILL HAVE**  
Armstrong strongly denies doping, but USADA officials have said their report will back up the move to sanction one of the most popular athletes in America.

**USADA has said** USADA has said it had 10 former teammates ready to testify against Armstrong before he chose not to take his case to an arbitration hearing.

**The list likely includes** previous Armstrong accusers Floyd Landis and Tyler Hamilton.

**WHO CAN STRIP HIM OF TOUR TITLES?**  
USADA says it does under the authority of the World Anti-Doping Code. The UCI says it wants to see USADA's report.

**The World Anti-Doping Code** gives the cycling union the right to appeal the sanctions against Armstrong that impact the world's most prestigious bike race and some fireworks between the agencies are expected.

**The UCI has clashed** with USADA over the Armstrong case, even challenging its authority to bring charges.

**WHAT HAPPENS ONCE UCI GETS THE REPORT?**  
UCI has been critical of USADA for taking so long, but once the report arrives, the cycling union will have 21 days to appeal to the Court of Arbitration for Sport.

**The report also** will go to the World Anti-Doping Agency, which also has the right to appeal, but so far has supported USADA's position in the Armstrong case.

**Armstrong's lawyers** say USADA should send UCI its entire case file.

**WHAT DO TOUR DE FRANCE OFFICIALS SAY?**  
The Tour has been silent while waiting for direction from UCI. It would be awkward for the world's most popular bike race to have to erase the name of a seven-time champion.

**In previous cases,** Tour organisers have taken a back seat in stripping the titles.

**When Alberto Contador** tested positive for clenbuterol during the 2010 race, the UCI first left the case to the Spanish Cycling Federation.

**WILL LANCE PUSH FOR UCI TO APPEAL?**  
It depends on how determined he is to see his name in the record books. Armstrong built worldwide brands for himself and his cancer-fighting foundation on the strength of those Tour victories.

**An appeal could mean** many more months or years defending himself against constant allegations. He chose to drop his fight in August and may be willing to give it up forever.

**Armstrong continues** to introduce himself as a seven-time Tour de France winner.



## NO SPIRIT HERE

### Wrestler Sushil makes sober point

**CHANDIGARH:** Raised in the true Indian wrestling tradition of milk-and-ghee, alcohol was never his thing. So, when a leading liquor brand offered Sushil Kumar ₹50 lakh to appear in a surrogate ad, the London Olympics silver medalist said a firm 'no'.

"I didn't want to be associated with a liquor brand in any form as it would send a wrong signal to the youth," said Kumar, the only Indian to win two back-to-back individual Olympic medals.

Surrogate ads involve promoting banned products such as cigarettes and alcohol in the guise of another product. For example, a liquor company can promote the brand through club soda or mineral water.

Kumar's bronze medal triumph in Beijing four summers ago earned him celebrity status and after the 29-year-old changed "the colour of his medal" in London, his place in Indian sporting history was sealed.

other than cricketers — advertisers found a star in Kumar, who now endorses Mountain Dew, Eicher tractors and NECC (National Egg Coordination Committee) earning ₹1 crore annually.

"The sporting tradition that I've been raised in values discipline way above money," said Kumar.

The liquor company has now turned to cricketers, though not all have been keen customers.

Two years ago, Sachin Tendulkar turned down a ₹20-crore offer from a top liquor brand.

Badminton star Pullela Gopichand, who coaches London bronze medalist Saina Nehwal, refused cigarette and cola ads after he won the prestigious All England Badminton Championship.

## Difficult to return, says Nadal

**LONDON:** Rafael Nadal has no timeline for his return to competitive tennis but the world number four did not completely rule out the possibility of returning from injury in time for next month's Davis Cup and ATP World Tour finals.



**Rafael Nadal has not played since suffering a shock defeat at Wimbledon in June.**

Nadal has not played since suffering a shock second-round Wimbledon defeat to Czech Lukas Rosol in June and has yet to return to the practise court, but the 26-year-old Spaniard left the door open for a comeback before the end of the season.

He conceded, however, that the chances of appearing at the ATP World Tour final in 26 days or helping Spain against the Czech Republic in the Nov. 16-18 Davis Cup final were remote.

"Impossible, no. But difficult, yes," said Nadal. "I want to go day-by-day, I go every day to the gym, the swimming pool to continue with my recovery. I am trying not to think that far."

Nadal missed the London Olympics and US Open as he fights to undo some of the damage inflicted on his fragile knees from years of competing on hard

courts. He spends his days in the gym, swimming and undergoing therapy treatments but, while he acknowledged feeling some improvements, he is not ready to hit the practise court.

"It has been very tough as I feel that my knee didn't improve in the right way ... but I can really feel the improvement over the last couple of weeks," said Nadal.

Nadal maintained he is not going to rush his return.

He has dealt with injuries several times throughout a career that has included a record 21 World Tour Masters titles and an Olympic gold medal but has entered uncharted territory with his current layoff.

**INDIAN CHALLENGE ENDS AT TASHKENT**  
**NEW DELHI:** Yuki Bhambrri, Vishnu Vardhan and Sanam Singh bowed out of the Tashkent Challenger. 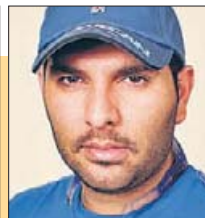

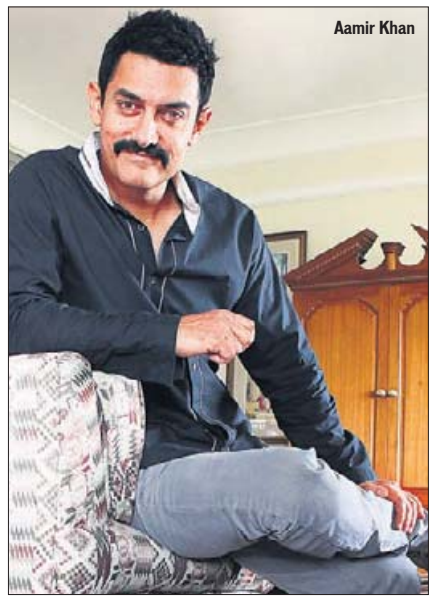

## DREAMING OUT LOUD

### Bedabrata Pain says that he didn't have any formal training in filmmaking

Dr Bedabrata Pain has done what few would dare to attempt. A senior research scientist in NASA for 18 years, Pain is known for inventing the RED Camera. He also has many more inventions to his credit. However, he put all his earnings from the royalty he got into making his debut film Chittagong, which releases on October 12. Having lived in the US for more than 26 years, Pain is surprisingly fluent in Bengali. Pain spoke to HT City on his debut film

and his transition from a scientist to a filmmaker. Excerpts:

**You are a scientist, inventor, director, producer and also a singer. What do you like most? Why do I have to choose? Can a parent choose between his or her kids? Each is equally close to my heart.**

**Having worked with NASA as a senior research scientist, one would have expected that you would have made a sci-fi as your debut film? I defy expectations. What excites and intrigues me are human failings and strivings, the human spirit**

that never gives up and the human capacity to visualise and create something new. I have always been a socially conscious person. That's the milieu in which I grew up. So it is not surprising that I made a film that depicts the quest of a boy, who overcomes self-doubt

and emerges as a winner. I will always make films that are exciting and accessible and celebrate human spirit.

**Will you ever make a sci-fi? Science fiction is such an oxymoron. Nevertheless, if I find a touching story, I'd do it.**

### How did the transition happen? Did you have any formal training in filmmaking?

Growing up in the 1960s and 1970s in Bengal, it was not possible to stay away from art, culture and political consciousness. I used to paint. I always loved poetry, music and singing. During my college and PhD days, I had participated in writing and had staged plays. In Columbia University I used to write my girlfriend's (later my wife) essays on film criticism. Telling a story has always intrigued me, right from an early age when I used to narrate my father's accounts of crossing the river Meghna in a way as if I had experienced it. This ability of seeing the story pass frame by frame before my eyes is what has drawn me to filmmaking. But I have never had any

formal training in filmmaking. I hadn't even been to a film's set before I stepped on the set of Chittagong. I had produced a film Amu before but I wasn't on the set, because I was looking after my kids in Los Angeles. So, it was purely a leap of faith.

### Why did you decide to make a film on the Chittagong Uprising?

After Amu, we were discussing the subject of my next film. I realised that the Chittagong Uprising was not known to anybody outside Bengal. Yet this is such an inspiring and unbelievable feat — of school kids and a schoolteacher taking on the mighty Britishers. I bet if this had happened in Europe, there would have been 10 films on the subject.

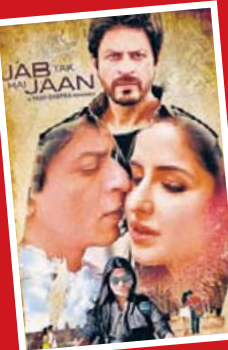

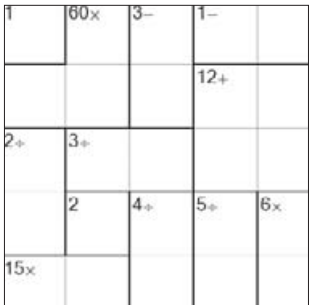

Though at the back of our minds, we know that the carb-loaded chicken burger isn't the best idea, we tend to go for it. But if you want to satiate your hunger and not wake up the next morning feeling guilty about bingeing, then pick that bar of dark chocolate instead or keep a strawberry shake handy.

"It is very essential to eat the correct food items at night. There is no physical activity during sleep, so no calories are utilised. All the calories from the food



consumed at night get converted and stored in the body as fat, which leads to weight gain," explains Mitali Doshi, dietician.

Here are a few options you may want to stock up on in order to binge right:

**Milk**  
"Milk is low on calories and fat content. Plus, it contains tryptophan, an amino acid

that helps you sleep well," explains Doshi, adding, "Calcium and vitamin D in the milk are added bonuses, they are healthy for your bones."

**Vegetables**  
Veggies may not seem like the most appetising midnight snack, but they are a great solution for diet-conscious bingers. "They are full of



vitamins, minerals and phytonutrients that your body uses to heal and nourish itself overnight. They also have high water content, so you tend to feel less dehydrated when you wake up," explains Doshi.

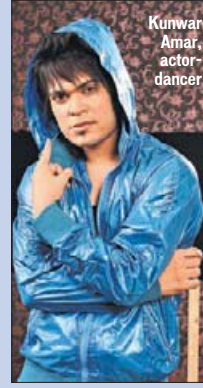
**Popcorn**  
Whole-grain popcorn (cooked without butter) is the snack if you're feeling like eating something light. "Not only is popcorn a good source of complex carbohydrates, it's also low on calories, if you skip the butter," says Doshi. And yes, for those wondering how pop-

corn will retain its flavour without the use of butter or salt, there is a solution. "Raid your spice cabinet — use lime powder to make it tangy, spice it up with cayenne pepper or use a dash of cinnamon to add some sweetness," says nutritionist Jyothi Sawant.

**Nuts**  
"Nuts are rich in antioxidants and full of fibre," explains Doshi, adding, "These nutritious nibbles also help regulate blood sugar and promote serotonin production in the body."

**Take us through the story of the film.**  
In 2006 we met Subodh Roy, one of the three youngest members who played an active role in the movement, on his deathbed in Kolkata. Hearing him recount the stories gave me goosebumps. We had found our protagonist. I figured it would be exciting to tell the story of Chittagong Uprising from the point of view of a 14-year-old. There were 60 school children led by Masterda Surya Sen (played by Manoj Bajpayee) and revolutionaries such as Anant Singh, Ganesh Ghosh, Nirmal Sen (played by Nawazuddin Siddiqui), Lokenath Bal, and Ambika Chakrabarti, who took on the British army in the battle of Jalalabad.

I was intrigued by Subodh da's story. He was a studious, frail boy, more suited for Oxford than becoming a rebel. He hadn't even played football. How the boy took up the gun is one of the most intriguing stories from history.

Another inspiring moment was my meeting with Benode Behari Chowdhury, now 102 years old, and is the last surviving member of the uprising.

But there was also another reason. I realised that most of the members of the uprising actually survived and went on to spearhead political movements in the future. Chittagong Uprising didn't finish with Masterda's hanging. It grew in many different ways. I wanted to tell those stories. So my Chittagong goes far beyond the armoury raid and the battle of Jalalabad.

Most historical films — especially films on freedom struggles — invariably become films with a depressing ending, where the protagonist dies. I did not want to make a film like that. But with Jhunku as my protagonist, Chittagong is a story of an incredible victory, which goes far beyond what happened in 1930.

# More than just a historical film

**Jaan Se?**  
I haven't seen the film yet. When Khelein Hum... was announced, I was on the 20th draft of my script. I finally filmed the 36th draft. For me, script is the king. So, right at that point, I decided that I wouldn't watch this film till my film comes out. I did not want to be influenced positively or negatively by the other film. So, now that my film is releasing, I will watch Khelein Hum....

**When you came to know that Ashutosh Gowariker is also making a film on the same topic, did you think of changing the subject?**

It was obviously very scary. In fact, after he announced the film, nobody in India was ready to finance my film. But

I had gone too far ahead. Besides, I am not in the habit of abandoning people or things. So I went ahead. Just

at that time, I had also received the royalty for my invention. After paying taxes, I had just enough left

to finance my film. That's how Chittagong got made. Nawazuddin Siddiqui wasn't a

**big name when you cast him in Chittagong. Have you watched Gangs of Wasseypur?**

As Anurag Kashyap pointed out during the music release, he saw all my actors in Chittagong and cast them for his film. So all these actors went from my set to the set of Gangs of Wasseypur, which is also a fabulous film. I met Nawaz in 2008 at National School of Drama in Delhi. I hadn't seen him before that (except in a tiny role in Munnabhai). But I knew I wanted Nawaz bhai for my film. I told him that I didn't know what role I had for him, but he is in Chittagong. So, he was the first guy to be cast for Chittagong.

**You shot the film on RED Camera.**

Against everybody's advice, I shot the film on RED, the core technology of which was invented by us. So I was completely familiar with it. I could not possibly pass up the opportunity to shoot with the camera. The film has a soft, radiant, warm look, which underscores the quest and innocence of a young 14-year-old.

**Are you working on any new subject?**

I am working on two films. The first is set in modern India, which interconnects three stories of love and faith lost and gained set against the backdrop of a political upheaval. It is located in three parts of India. My second story is an English film set during World War II.

**A lot of Mumbai-based Bengali filmmakers are making films in Bengali. Do you have any such plans?**

Absolutely. The topics of my films will always be those of love stories set in times of political turmoil. I really want to go back to good Bengali literature for my films.
